#### **BOARD PROPOSE UTILITY RATE CHANGES**

On September 19th, 2019 the District Board of Directors approved the following **preliminary** changes to the water and sewer monthly rates:

### **Monthly Residential Water Rates**

Service Charge

and 1st 500 cuft \$33.00

Next 1,000 cuft \$6.46 per 100 cuft/748 gallons Over 1,500 cuft \$9.68 per 100 cuft/748 gallons

### **Monthly Commercial Water Rates**

Service Charge

and 1st 500 cuft \$33.00

Over 500 cuft 6.46 per 100 cuft/748 gallons

### **Monthly Sewer Rates**

Single Family \$46.21

Multi Family \$46.21 first RUE plus \$20.63

each additional RUE or unit

Commercial \$46.21 first RUE plus \$20.63

each additional RUE

Water rates are scheduled to increase annually by 3%, and sewer rates by 10% for the next five years. All new rates take effect July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020. The Board will continue its discussion and these rates may change at future public meetings and a public hearing before the July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020 effective date. The Board may take action to make **preliminary** changes to the **electric monthly rates** at its October 17<sup>th</sup>, 2019 Board Meeting. Please attend to provide your input on proposed rate changes.

You are invited to join RID's Board of Directors, the California State Water Board, and fellow community members to celebrate the completion of six new state funded water tanks on <u>Wednesday, November 6<sup>th</sup> at Kennedy Tank site</u> (Shelter Cove & Beach Road junction) at <u>11AM</u>. Together we will re-dedicate Kennedy Tank, our million-gallon tank and workhorse of RID's water system, and celebrate our success to provide clean water to Shelter Cove for decades to come.

Everyone in our community makes projects like this possible and that's why I would love to see you and yours on Wednesday November 6<sup>th</sup> at 11AM at Kennedy Tank Site. RID staff will distribute additional information on event in the coming weeks through our website, Pioneers email and community Facebook pages.

Finally, as the current fire season comes to its near end, I would like to take a moment to thank everyone in our community for helping to make and keep our community fire safe. Property owners along with help from Shelter Cove Fire, Cal Fire and the Chipper Days program completed a tremendous amount of vegetation removal and treatment this past year. I also want to give a shout out to Humboldt County Department of Public Works for completing miles of roadside brushing within many neighborhoods of Shelter Cove.

Chipper Days and County road-side clearing will continue through the fall and today RID staff is busy preparing a new Cal Fire grant application to obtain additional funds for planning and treatment activities on RID lands, County roadways and on private lands. RID, Shelter Cove Fire and our CERT team will continue to work on other efforts to improve the safety of our community including installing new intersection mirrors, emergency sirens and evacuation signage.
