- A.) WSPP and Infrastructure Tax Update was discussed Option 4 agreed by eight of nine municipalities.
- B.) Town of La Crosse requested support for FDOT request for Pedestrian Street Crossing and Beacon at the intersection of SR 235W and SR 121. Vice Mayor Kelley made a motion for the mayor to send a letter of request to FDOT. Councilman Cheshire seconded the motion. The motion carries.


Public Comment:

Resident shares concerns of road improvements being behind and wishes the County would prioritize the road improvements and stop the parks renovations.


Resident shares interest of the return of mobile library. Responded by the chair that they are continuing working on hiring drivers of the mobile.
