

Dear Juice Newton: Hi, my name is John Crane Moser and I've been a loyal and loving fan of yours for 9 years. I was 11 then, I'm 19 now. I didn't join your fan

club until recently, though.

Back in the early '80's I was watching Solid Gold, and a rising artist, named Juice Newton came on singing her big smash "Queen Of Hearts". She gave such an energetic and awesome performance that it inspired and sparked a dream of my own, which is to perform and record in a way that is as moving as that special artist. After that Solid Gold performance I was hooked. and shortly afterwards, you released an album that is my most favorite album of all time, "Quiet Lies". The albums Dirty Looks and Can't Wait All Night followed, and with them, my respect and love for your music. I especially like "Runaway Hearts", "Tell Her No" and "Can't Wait All Night", those that have pop-rock flavor to them. In 1982, my mother introduced me to the guitar, an "Espana" acoustic, and within 6 months I learned all the notes, keys and chords on it. I nurtured my singing and playing by performing along to your records all these years since '82. No one else's unique style can inspire me in the way your's does.

I'm a songwriter. I think writing is a wonderful creative outlet. I've started sending out demos of my songs and have received a little bit of attention and interest in my music. My music is my life, it is my everything, and I have you to thank for sparking the musical side

in me.

Someday, when I make it, and I truly believe that I'm going to succeed, I will credit you for being my No. 1 influence, and the one who inspired me.

National Park.



Playing to the first of two nearly sold-out Redding Convention Center audiences as part of a Redding Firefighters Association's fund-raiser, Newton displayed the powerful crystalline voice and country-rock flavor that has earned her hits like "Queen Of Hearts" and "Love's Been a Little Bit Hard on Me". She opened her set with "One Touch Is Worth a Thousand Words" before stopping the music briefly while her stage crew tracked down a buzz in the public address system. "I want to make sure this is perfect because you people are important out there, If you people weren't out there, we wouldn't be up here." Newton said. During an acoustic segment, Newton sang a touching rodeo ballad called "Ride 'Em Cowboy" and followed it with another story song "Shot Full Of Love". All in all, she was very well received.

JUICE NEWTON POURS IT ON - Country singer gets into high gear.

"Juice Newton arrives for her Nugget debut through May2nd, 1990, both enthusiastic and apprehensive, the former because it looks like her recording career is about to kick-start back into action, the latter, because of a schedule that takes her 14 straight nights without a break. 'I've never done that - ever', Newton told me. 'That's 28 shows in a row, which will be a unique experience, to say the least. I'm sure it's a good room and all that but I'll have a very little baby along and will be working all the time. The baby is 5-month old Tyler. Newton, busy trying to get back on a straight career track, was on the road three weeks after his birth. 'A baby is pretty much a little sack you have to carry with you, but he's a lot of extra effort. Still, having him is the most exciting thing imaginable, and he is very beautiful, definitely very beautiful.'

She has 'new pieces of product' in line for a possible album release soon, but needs a producer. One possibility is Randy Scruggs, Nashville, TN., who is responsible for The Nitty Gritty Dirt Band's 'Will The Circle Be Unbroken II' album." Before our current success, we had received enough encouragement to accept the possibility that we would become journeyman musicians - moderately known, moderately successful.' Juice Newton is at a higher level than 'journeyman' now, for sure... and a big enough talent, with enough recognition factor, to play The Sparks Nugget's Celebrity Theatre, a jewelbox of a venue for the vocal talents of Newton."

NUGGET TURNS UP THE JUICE

"The power bill at John Ascuga's Nugget in Sparks, Nevada, will no doubt be larger than usual this month. Why? Because there's two weeks worth of Juice jolting the Celebrity Showroom - Juice Newton, that is. Newton struts onto the stage with acoustic guitar at the ready and her five-piece band warmed up, launching her 50-odd minute set with an upbeat country rock number followed by a slow, harmony-rich version of the 70's hit, 'Ride' Em Cowboy. This was followed by an exquisite three song acoustic set. The first, 'Cry To Me' a bluegrass-infused beauty featuring fine mandolin runs which frame Newton's breathy vocal approach quite well, (she sounds more like Patsy Cline here), followed by 'Tell Me True', which is more squarely in the Cline school, a heartfelt yearner and betrayal, and getting on with life. But it's

with the next couple of selections, 'Sail Away' and 'I Could Never Hurt You' that she really lets loose with those characteristic, curious cute high-note hitches - at the same time making the numbers seem quite effortless. It's obvious she's no technician, but rather a singer who lets her feelings take over. At this point Newton steps out of the spotlight for awhile as her excellent band works through 'Don't You', a song written by Newton's rhythm guitar player, Otha Young, and features Newton in some playful guitar tete-a-tete with the lead man, who gets in plenty of fine, fret-busting licks throughout the show. At any rate, Juice Newton is a wonderful change of pace on the Nugget's schedule, and she seems at ease in this intimate, plush, setting."

"Have you seen Juice Newton yet? Well, let me encourage you to do so. This young lady of many stage moods is wonderful.... she really can sing country music. From the first time she hit the charts with Angel of the Morning I remember feeling 'she's singing just for me.' That's special! While her career has moved with her musical changes, that special quality has not. While she and her audience seem to be best in tune when she's rocking The Celebrity Showroom of the Nugget, for me, the Newton I enjoy best is when she sells a big wide ranging ballad, and I really do mean selling!
