### Preventing Fire Mishaps at Christmas

- Make sure that smoke alarms are working before decorating for the holidays.
- Turn off holiday lights before leaving the house or going to bed.
- Keep your natural tree: watered, secured in a sturdy stand so that it doesn't tip over and away from all heat sources
- If you buy an artificial tree, be sure it's labeled "fire-retardant."
- Keep lit candles away from Christmas trees.
- Stay in the room when candles are lit. Supervise kids around them.
- Blow out candles before going to bed.
- Don't overload indoor or outdoor electrical outlets and check wires for fraying or damage.
- Never burn paper or pine boughs, because they can float out of the chimney and ignite a nearby home or your own roof.
- Have a family emergency plan in the event of a fire.
