
With Easter approaching, have you considered the wonderful implications of the resurrection of Jesus Christ? As Christians, we should and we should often, beyond just one time a year. 1 Corinthians 15 is known as the "Resurrection Chapter." In this chapter, Paul stated the devastating consequences had Jesus not been raised from the dead. Our faith would be futile, and we would still be spiritually dead in our sins (v.17). Past believers, who have died, would not be in heaven, but would have perished (v. 18). Present believers, who currently hope in Christ, are of all people most to be pitied (v. 19). Everything hinges on the resurrection of Jesus Christ!

Thankfully, Paul declared, "But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead" (v.20). This is what makes the Gospel the "good news." And so, those devastating consequences become wonderful blessings of assurance. Our faith in Christ is meaningful and valuable. In Christ, we are delivered from the bondage to sins, brought to new life by His resurrection power. Past believers are now in the presence of the Lord Jesus, which as Paul said is far better (Phil. 1:23). Present believers have hope in Christ, something that this lost and dark world should desire.

The resurrection was God's stamp of approval, His "Amen," to the atoning sacrifice of His Son on the cross of Calvary. Yet, there is one more wonderful implication of resurrection of Jesus Christ. This one has a powerful practical application attached to it. 1 Corinthians 15 is a long chapter, but it ends to make this point, "Be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain."

Paul is offering us the assurance of knowing that our faithfulness and service to the Lord, both in our personal walk with Christ and in our devotion to the local church (New Hope), will not go in vain. Our faithfulness and service to the Lord always produces fruit, whether we see it or not, and this assurance is based on the certainty of the resurrection of Christ Himself, which all Christianity hinges on. This is the highest motivation for endurance in the Christian life. This Easter, let New Hope continue to be "steadfast, immovable, and always abounding in the work of the Lord."
