



Time Management

"It is not easy to shut out the world, set aside a few minutes by yourself, and spend time in God's Word and prayer. But it is essential if we are to grow in our relationship with God and be strengthened for the battles ahead. Don't delay. Begin now to spend time alone with God every day." Billy Graham

How do you manage your God time? How are you at managing your time, period?

Wikipedia describes time management as the "process of planning and controlling how much time to spend on specific activities."

The *Tewksbury Town Crier*_enumerates the 5 Ps of time management: "prioritize, plan, procrastination, productivity, and positivity." (who doesn't love a good alliteration? Who isn't guilty of a little procrastination?)

Princeton University's McGraw Center for Teaching and Learning lists ten "principles for effective time management for balance, well-being and success" with bullet points highlighting commitment, pursue fun with a vengeance, time vs task focus, one thing at a time, block out time, first things first, routine, flexibility, respond vs react, and organize your environment."

My good friend Google provides productivity experts galore illuminating 21 Tips, 10 Useful Tips, 7 Skills, 9 Key Skills, 25 Best Tools and on and on all with the goal of managing time.

How many idioms come instantly to mind relative to that finite measurement? High time, borrowed time, about time, make time, in the nick of time. We use them, we understand what they mean. They challenge us, they stress us out, they keep us hopping. All in the pursuit of lassoing our time into manageable chunks. Here's the worst one...killing time. Oh my!

"Teach us the brevity of life so that we may grow in wisdom." (Psalm 90:12)

And yet...

We all are given the same 60 seconds in a minute, 60 minutes in an hour, 24 hours every day, 7 days a week and 52 of those every year. When it comes to years, well, that's in God's hands as is each one of those seconds making up our minutes, hours days and weeks. What does God say?

"For everything there is a season, a time for every activity under heaven." (Ecclesiastes 3:1)

Seasons of life come and go. I remember a house full of school age kids, all with activities and sports; places to go, meetings to attend, events to watch. My overbooked schedule led to overwhelmed me ricocheting from car pool to practice, meets to meetings. Those overflowing, color-coded calendar blocks mocked my efforts to manage. Where did the time go? Worse yet, I felt guilty if some random day had nothing on the docket! Slacker! Can you relate?

Looking back from this new season, I know time managed me, not the other way around. It's clear now that God has a better idea for our time and how to manage it than most of us practice, whether busy parents or upwardly mobile professionals and everyone else in between. In fact, the Bible tells us,

"We can make our plans, but the Lord determines our steps." (Proverbs 16:9)

Wikipedia may have a point about controlling the time we spend on activities, but remember God has the final say on how that planning pans out.

So, we're smart if we consult our Lord before making those plans in the first place. Thoughtfully, prayerfully, we are served well by following His precepts, knowing "the plans of the diligent lead to profit as surely as haste leads to poverty." (Proverbs 21:5)

Can we recognize that profit need not mean wealth and poverty, the lack of it? Our greatest profit comes when our souls are enriched and our minds armored with wisdom fueling our passage through time in healthy ways

"Pay careful attention, then, to how you walk—not as unwise people but as wise—making the most of the time, because the days are evil. So don't be foolish, but understand what the Lord's will is." (Ephesians 5:15-17 CSB)

We suffer spiritual poverty when filling our time with busyness. Haste robs us of peace. Ungodly pursuits crush the soul.

"Don't waste your time on useless work, mere busywork, the barren pursuits of darkness." (Ephesians 5:11)

All this is not to say we shouldn't be busy and productive or that hurrying is somehow sinful. No, it means we should follow God's timetable, walk at His speed, keep Him on the schedule, seek His will before planning our days.

"Commit everything you do to the Lord. Trust him, and he will help you." (Psalm 37:5 NLT)

Then go ahead, fill your calendar, plan your schedule, record your reminders on your phone. God rewards hard work, Scripture instructs us to be productive as long as we remember to keep the main thing, the main thing. That is, calling upon the Lord, seeking His will, asking for wisdom, worshiping, and sitting quietly, humbly in His presence.

Joyce Meyer reminds us that "Spending time with God is the key to our strength and success in all areas of life. Be sure that you never try to work God into your schedule, but always work your schedule around Him."

These are our moments in time, our one life to live this side of forever. How we manage them secures our heavenly rewards, so live fully, managing our fleeting time faithfully. These lovely lyrics from *Life is Passing Quickly as a Vapor* by Ruth Evangelisti sing a timely message.

"Life is passing quickly as a vapor; soon our opportunities are past."

May God give us grace to work and labor, only what is done for Christ will last.

Every day the Lord gives precious chances, to deny ourselves and do His will

Soon the day is past as night advances. Let us use the time that we have still."

Lord, grant us wisdom to manage the precious time you've given us well and to Your glory. Amen.
