

Dear Padre,

What are deacons' duties? Can they preside at wedding ceremonies? What about baptisms and other duties usually reserved for priests?

The Catholic Church has two kinds of deacons: transitional deacons, seminarians in the last stage of their studies for the priesthood, and permanent deacons, men who will remain deacons.

Transitional and permanent deacons can baptize, give homilies at Mass, give blessings (for example, the blessing of throats on St. Blaise's feast day),

perform the Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, and preside at wedding and funeral services where there is no Mass.

Neither type of deacon can administer the sacrament of reconciliation. They can visit and bless the sick, but they cannot anoint them. Deacons can distribute holy Communion, but they cannot consecrate the bread and wine.

Unlike transitional deacons, permanent deacons can be

married. If a deacon's wife dies, he may not remarry except in certain circumstances, for example, if his children are still very young. Unmarried permanent deacons must remain unmarried.

Deacons are vital to the life of the Church. Many permanent deacons have families and full-time jobs in addition to their Church work. We don't thank deacons and their families enough for the many sacrifices they make for the people of God.





Have you experienced the loss of a loved one through death? Perhaps a friendship came to an end? Maybe a job that brought you so much life no longer exists. We all experience loss more often than we think. Sometimes that loss can take a toll on our own self. A five-week grief support session will begin on Friday, February 28th from 10am-11:30am. For some, it is helpful to go on this journey with others. While no two people experience grief the same way, one can rest in the fact nobody has to grieve alone.

Around the Diocese and Parish Neighborhood

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY HOW YOUR HELP IS USED

We are sure many of you have wondered and some have asked us for more details on how your donations and support for the SVDP Ministry is actually used to help the poor and disadvantaged of our area. In the next two weeks we will lay out how we take your help with donations, material goods, and in some cases with your ideas and direct help with those in need in our community. This week we will present the types of gifts you provide us and in turn are given to the poor to help them meet their basic needs. Next week we will present the actual figures of receipts and disbursements we have administered monthly during the past year.

We receive funds throughout the year primarily in the monthly envelopes for the St. Vincent de Paul parish ministry but also by individual giving at tax time or through some other fund raising mechanism like the Lenten Alms Cups and the Anyway's dining receipt rebates. This money is combined with the goods we receive through our semi-annual clothing and household item collections with the trucks coming to the parish. Around tax time we also receive special donations from those who can use a charitable tax deduction which helps both the donor and our work with the poor. Our overhead is virtually nil as we use the "Ask and you shall receive" concept which the Lord advised when we need help with administering the program. Because our work is almost totally carried out by volunteer Members, we seldom have admin costs.

The help we provide to those in need is to meet their most basic of needs: Housing, Food, Clothing, Utilities, Healthcare, Transportation, Employment, and Education through direct assistance and much information sharing and referrals to other resources. Above all we pray that all we serve are kept in God's sight and are focused on living right.

Next week we will present in this spot the actual costs and month-by-month movement of funding and services between our donors and the numbers we serve. Let us all remain the Beneficiaries of God's love.
