

2020 – 49th ANNUAL RICHVILLE UCC FALL FESTIVAL

It's finally here! On **Saturday, October 3**, we will be having our annual Fall Festival Event. It may look and function a little differently this year, but the outcome will be the same...**FUNDING OUR OUTREACH PROGRAMS!**

YOU STILL HAVE TIME TO PARTICIPATE BY:

1. **BUYING A DINNER TICKET (**CARRY OUT ONLY**).** The dinner will be held from 4:30 - 6:30 PM. Instructions for food pickup will be given as you pull into the church parking lot. Delivery will be available if you don't have transportation by notifying the church office by Thursday Oct 1.

The dinner menu will be Swiss Steak, Mashed Potatoes and Gravy, Green Beans, Coleslaw, Roll and Dessert. Tickets are \$12 for Adults and \$6 for Kids (age 3-8). We will prepare and sell tickets for 200 meals. Any meals remaining will be sold at the door until they are gone. To make this a safe event, face masks and social distancing will be observed while you are in the church.


I would like to thank, in advance, the Spiritual Life Committee, Outreach Committee, and Finance Committee for the planning and hard work which has gone into making this event a success!

it's **HARVEST** time

“God’s laws are perfect. They protect us, make us wise, and give us joy and light. God’s laws are pure, eternal, just. They are more desirable than gold. They are sweeter than honey dripping from a honeycomb. For they warn us away from harm and give success to those who obey them.”

With all that has changed (and is constantly subject to change) in nearly every arena of life over the course of the last 7 months, I want to suggest a couple of things that we can count on:

- 1.) *GOD is good*
- 2.) *We have work to do.*

Fall is upon us, and that is traditionally the time of year to gather-in the results of the previous seasons' labors and ready ourselves for the next one. Even amidst dramatic shifts in how we function. Despite impediments. Regardless of how fruitful or unfruitful we may have previously been.

Yes: we've all been suffering under the realities of a global pandemic, economic shocks, social unease, division within our nation, and assorted uncertainties about tomorrow. But how is any of that really any different than any other era of human existence?

Sure, our challenges may be more obvious and their impacts are felt more severely by more of the populous. However, isn't there a blessing in that?

We're ALL going through the SAME struggles TOGETHER.

Think about the annual life of a farmer.

Agricultural folks have to rally with one another and bale the hay, till the soil, fertilize the field, plant the seed, water the crop, reap the harvest, tend to the flock...

...WHETHER OR NOT the weather has been kind; the yield is tiny or bountiful; they are getting along with the neighbor, employee, or family member whom they NEED to work with.

All of this is to say that, even as we collectively contend with this prolonged period of “altered norms”, Spring and Summer have still turned to Autumn. It is time to “bring in the sheaves” (as the old hymn goes). We might not know precisely how effective our strategies will be, and we can’t guarantee how viable the seeds we plant will be. Yet, the surest way to fail is “sit on our hands”.

So, with that in mind, I want to ask us all to spend some time during October and November praying and meditating on the **Core Values, Mission, and Vision Statements** of our congregation. Let’s ask ourselves how we might align our ministry more thoroughly and effectively with these documents, the Scriptures, and The Way of Jesus. Of course we have to take into account the unique concerns of the strange days we’re living through. Still, humanity (in general) and The Church (most assuredly) has weathered and overcame far worse countless times throughout history.

The LORD has blessed each of us with energy, creativity, insight, particular skills, and specific talents; and when we pour those things into our shared life, remarkable things are possible –even in the face of difficulties. When our Jewish forebearers had their Temple destroyed and were exiled and scattered in foreign lands, the manner in which they supported one another, worshiped and maintained their spiritual identity had to shift, but the basics of daily prayer and care remained (and those things maintained them during their hardships).

Here, I want to affirm you all. You have “rolled with the punches” since March. You have been “quick on your feet” when circumstances changed abruptly. You’ve been flexible and understanding as we’ve had to use alternative formats for meetings, small groups, missions, and worship. You remain faithful and generous. And all of that, when dedicated to GOD and empowered by The Holy Spirit, allows us to look toward tomorrow with confidence and hope for a new (probably different, and perhaps better) harvest.

To that end, even as we need to continue engaging our ministry in safe and responsible ways, I want to catch-up with those of you I’ve not been able to see or speak with. So, I’m proposing that folks might want to schedule **“Porch Time with The Pastor”** (at least while the weather holds out), or a **“Meal with The Minister”**. In either case, I envision making appointments with people who can’t make it to church functions in-person. We would get together for socially-distanced conversations (whether at your home or the campus of RUCC). We can talk, pray, dream-up creative solutions for the

future. Now, amidst this, most of the medical and residential facilities have some significant restrictions on who, how and when visitors are allowed (and each place has different regulations), but as of last week, the governor has stated that some of those limitations will be lightening (so I’m optimistic that we can figure something out).

Safety protocols will be in place while we enjoy our green space. To end the festivities, we plan on implementing the "Best Dressed Pet" contest as our departing ½ hour attraction. 



The budget is in a place that we feel that we can maintain it. The committee put together a rental agreement for the outdoor space. Debbie Ciesielczyk made a motion to approve the outdoor rental agreement. Changes would be on a case per case basis. Jackie Schlemmer 2nd the motion. Motion passed. The September dinner and the Fall Festival dinner will be hosted by the Finance & Stewardship Committee. They will be drive thru service with payment via PayPal or with a check at the time of pickup. Reservations made ahead of time through the church office. Fall Festival will still have the bake sale and basket fundraiser. We do not have the support to hold monthly dinners, so we decided on quarterly dinners.

PASTOR'S TIME: Written report submitted.


