

Saint Francis de Sales "Man is the perfection of the universe; the spirit is the perfection of man; love, that of the spirit; and charity, that of love." He died in 1622, declared a Doctor of the Church in 1877.

The Conversion of Saint Paul "That dear preacher Paul...was a wolf, but he became a lamb, a gracious vessel of love - and the fire with which Christ filled his vessel he carried through the whole world," by Saint Catherine of Siena.

Saint Timothy and Saint Titus were companions of Saint Paul and collaborators in the ministry to the Gentiles; Timothy overseer of the church of Ephesus and Titus of Crete.

Saint Angela Merici foundress of the Ursulines, the first teaching Order especially for poor young girls; sought re-evangelization of families through the education of future wives and mothers; she died in 1540.

Saint Tomas Aquinas a Dominican friar, his writings display the profound harmony between faith and reason, and have formed students of theology for centuries; he died in 1274, declared a Doctor of the Church in 1567.

Brothers and Sisters,

This third Sunday in Ordinary Time has been designated by the church as the Sunday of the Word of God. It is a day for us to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of his word and enables us to proclaim its wonderful riches.

In our first reading from the prophet Nehemiah, Ezra the priest reads the words of the law before the people, and they react quite strongly: weeping and prostrating themselves. Because of having been in exile in Babylon for decades, most of the people gathered to hear Ezra had never worshipped in Jerusalem before, never in public, never in such a large gathering. Many are hearing God's word proclaimed openly for the first time in their lives. Many of them wondered if this day would ever come. Many of us have felt the same way over the past two years. For weeks, months or over a year, we did not join together in worship, and we rejoiced when we were able to return as did the faithful people of Judah that day after decades in exile.

In our second reading St. Paul teaches that together we are Christ's body, made up of many different parts. When St. Paul wrote what we call the First Letter to the Corinthians, he was dealing with a divided community. Many members were boasting about the importance of their different gifts. Using the image of the body, Paul wants the people to understand that at baptism, the Holy Spirit draws all believers together into fellowship with Christ as one body. Therefore, no member can be considered greater than another: all are equally important because each contributes to the well-being of the whole, the "one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church".

Beginnings are important. The first line of a book, or the first scene of a movie, can determine its success or failure. Some are truly memorable. Maybe some of you remember such lines or scenes that remain in our memory long after we've read the book or seen the movie. Alone among the evangelists, Luke sets today's gospel reading at the very beginning of Jesus' ministry which begins in his hometown. In the synagogue at Nazareth, standing in front of the people, Jesus unrolls the scroll and reading the scripture passage from the prophet Isaiah sums up the heart of his ministry: to bring "good news to the poor...liberty to captives...sight to the blind...to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord." A "year acceptable to the Lord" (Luke 4:19) refers to a once-every-fifty years event, during which debts were forgiven, slaves freed, and land reverted back to its owners or heirs. What Jesus is doing is setting out his own agenda and proclaiming the word of God.

In his apostolic letter instituting this Sunday as the Sunday of the Word of God, Pope Francis commented: "These words contain a great teaching...the bible is the book of the Lord's people, who, in listening to it, move from dispersion and division towards unity. The word of God unites believers and makes them one people."

Today Jesus invites us through our baptism to be a part of his mission, his ministry. He went back to his hometown to begin it. He calls us to do something similar: If we are to share his mission, this is where we "begin," among the people we know.

With this convocation, Pope Francis invites the entire Church to reflect on a theme that is decisive for its life and mission: "It is precisely this path of synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennium."² This journey, which follows in the wake of the Church's "renewal" proposed by the Second Vatican Council, is both a gift and a task: by journeying together and reflecting together on the journey that has been made, the Church will be able to learn through Her experience which processes can help Her to live communion, to achieve participation, to open Herself to mission. Our "journeying together" is, in fact, what most effectively enacts and manifests the nature of the Church as the pilgrim and missionary People of God. ² FRANCIS, Address for the ceremony commemorating the 50th anniversary of the institution of the Synod of Bishops (17 October 2015).

We recall that the purpose of the Synod and therefore of this consultation, is not to produce documents, but ***"to plant dreams, draw forth prophecies and visions, allow hope to flourish, inspire trust, bind up wounds, weave together relationships, awaken a dawn of hope, learn from one another and create a bright resourcefulness that will enlighten minds, warm hearts, give strength to our hands."***





GOD'S LAW

Scripture has always held God's law to be the path to human happiness. In today's first reading, Ezra the priest reads the scroll of the law to the people returned from exile. They weep—then are joyful. Israel's relationship with God had always been defined by how they kept and lived God's law. The author of Psalm 96 likewise praises the law of God as the source of wisdom, joy and enlightenment, purity and justice.

In his advice to the bickering Corinthians, Paul points out that, just as God has made all parts of a human body essential for the health of the whole, living as "Christ's body" requires that each member be recognized as necessary for the good of all. Finally, in Luke's Gospel Jesus claims that the Spirit is sending him to relieve human suffering. Like Ezra, he is reading from a scroll, proclaiming God's "law" of mercy to those in need.



La comunidad es importante. La comunidad es esencial. La comunidad es crucial. Este mensaje es el fundamento de las lecturas de hoy de Nehemías, Corintios y Lucas. La lectura del rollo por parte de Esdras se hace delante de la comunidad, incluyendo – un acto radical en aquella época – a mujeres y niños con edad suficiente para entender, grupos que normalmente no se cuentan entre los que escuchan la proclamación de la promesa de Dios. La comunidad es importante. El Cuerpo místico de Cristo, como el cuerpo humano, funciona mejor y más plenamente cuando todos los miembros desempeñan el papel para el que fueron destinados. La comunidad es esencial. La palabra de Dios se cumple cuando la comunidad es esencial. La palabra de Dios se cumple cuando la comunidad la ha escuchado y ha sido testigo de ella. En Lucas, el bautismo y las tentaciones de Jesús en el desierto conducen a la escena de la sinagoga, que luego llevará a Jesús a su ministerio público de proclamar el reino de Dios. Finalmente viajará a Jerusalén y a su crucifixión. La comunidad es crucial.

UN CUERPO, UN JESÚS

Nuestro calendario litúrgico separa las diferentes escenas del Evangelio, lo que a veces puede hacerles un flaco favor. El año litúrgico, por supuesto, tiene su propio ritmo y finalidad, en el que insertan los relatos de la vida de Jesús. Sin embargo, cuando Lucas organizaba su Evangelio (para “Teófilo”, el amigo de Dios que encontramos en la introducción del Evangelio de hoy), la escena de hoy formaba parte de una estructura triple: el bautismo de Jesús, las tentaciones en el desierto, el anuncio de la misión pública en la sinagoga de Nazaret. El vínculo es el Espíritu Santo, que descendió sobre el cuerpo de Jesús en su bautismo, que llenó su cuerpo mientras soportaba su prueba de cuarenta días, y que está sobre su cuerpo para anunciar y realizar el reino de Dios, misión que cumple con su cuerpo en la cruz. La encarnación (el “encarnarse”) de Jesús, que pensamos en relación con su nacimiento, sigue siendo el centro de su historia.

UN CRISTO, UN CUERPO

La lectura de Corintios de la semana pasada se refería al único Espíritu que otorga muchos dones, pero que es la fuente de nuestra unidad. Pablo continúa hoy este tema utilizando la imagen del cuerpo, cuyos diferentes miembros tienen cada uno una función importante y distinta. El Espíritu del bautismo forma ese único Cuerpo místico de Cristo. El Espíritu del bautismo llena los numerosos miembros, pero los une siempre como uno solo. El Espíritu del bautismo está en cada miembro, como lo estuvo para Jesús en la sinagoga de Nazaret. Ese Espíritu de nuestro bautismo nos unge a cada uno de nosotros como miembros del Cuerpo de Cristo para ser alegres, proclamar la libertad, traer una visión más clara, levantar a los oprimidos, anunciar el reino de Dios a todos. Como miembros diferentes del Cuerpo de Cristo, cada uno está llamado a hacer esto a su manera. Podemos enfrentarnos a la oposición o al rechazo, como hizo Jesús, pero siempre podemos volver a acudir con fe al Espíritu de nuestro bautismo, que sigue estando con nosotros.
