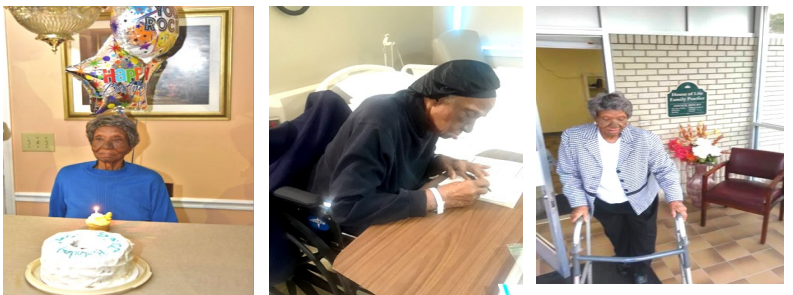

Eunice Trent Suber, a native of Winston-Salem, NC, was born on November 13, 1918, the daughter of Robert and Lurla Lazenberry Suber. Blessed with a long and rewarding life, God called her home on November 21, 2022 after she recently celebrated her 104th birthday.

A proud graduate of the historic Simon G. Atkins High School Class of 1936, she later enrolled in Forsyth Technical Community College and studied Early Childhood Education. Her training subsequently afforded her the opportunity to become the Daycare Center Director at Saints Home United Methodist Church in Winston-Salem, NC.

Faithfully involved in her community for many years, she joined New Bethel Baptist Church in 1937. There she was President of the Willing Workers, a member of the Missionary Circle, the Journalistic Society and the Sunday School. She also sang with the church choir.
