Saint Aloysius Gonzaga was born into a wealthy family; at seventeen, he renounced his inheritance, entered the Jesuits; while taking care of plague victims, he caught the disease himself and died in 1591 at the age of twenty-four.

Saint Paulinus was elected Bishop by the people of Nola in year 409; he died in 431.

Saint John Fisher and Saint Thomas More both martyrs in 1535 for refusing to support King Henry VIII's divorce from Queen Catherine.

The Solemnity of The Nativity of Saint John the Baptist, One of three birthdays on the Church's calendar, the Church celebrates the Nativity of John, because of his special place in God's saving plan. Magnificat

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — Melchizedek brought out bread and wine and blessed Abram (Genesis 14:18-20).

Psalm — You are a priest forever, in the line of Melchizedek (Psalm 110).

Second Reading — Paul gives his description of the institution of the Eucharist (1 Corinthians 11:23-26).

Gospel — Jesus feeds the crowd with five loaves and two fish (Luke 9:11b-17).

Brothers and Sisters,

As Christians we are called to share in Christ's life and sacrifice. On this Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, traditionally known as Corpus Christi, we remember that Jesus Christ offered his body and blood to redeem us from sin, giving his earthly life to give all of us heavenly life.

In our first reading we are introduced to Melchizedek the "high priest of God" and king of Salem. Other than that, we know very little about him. Today's reading recounts a story between Abraham and Melchizedek. Abraham had set out on an expedition to save his nephew Lot. Lot had been taken captive and all his possessions had been seized and taken as plunder. With an army of only 318, Abraham had defeated four kings, rescued Lot, recovered their possessions and returned home. Abraham realized his victories were due to "Yahweh's" protection. In response to God's protection, Abraham promised to give to Melchizedek, the "priest of the Most-High God" a tenth of everything he owned. Abraham gave homage to Melchizedek because he spoke for the God of all creation, the author of all blessings.

In our second reading, Paul instructs the Corinthian community, struggling with internal divisions, on the meaning of the Lord's Supper. He describes Jesus giving his Body and Blood, a Jewish expression for the whole person, "for you" (1Cor 11:24). Jesus connected the Last Supper with his death as a gift of himself for others. The instruction "Do this in remembrance of me" (Cor 11:24) means to imitate Jesus in giving life to and for others. This is how Christians are to "proclaim the death of the Lord" (Cor 11:24).

We hear in the gospel today how Jesus fed the crowds: he took bread, blessed it, broke it and gave it to them. These are the same actions that are at the heart of every Mass. So, Jesus feeds us today with his body and blood.

Meals are important. Perhaps many of us have lost sight of that in today's fast-food society. It seems so time-consuming today for people to sit down to a meal together. But if you can make the time, sitting down at a table to eat with others is a great thing to do. In ancient times, meals were regarded as very important occasions. In Old Testament times, salvation and heaven were often pictured in terms of a meal, a wonderful banquet with abundant food and drink for everyone. For Jesus, meals were very significant. This incident in Jesus' life was seen as so important that the gospel writers tell of it no less than six times in the four gospels.

Luke seems to go out of his way to show the close connection between the feeding of the crowd and the Eucharist by the way he tells the story: he describes how Jesus took the loaves, blessed them, broke them and gave them. These four actions are exactly the actions of Jesus at the Last Supper. Only in Luke's version of this story are the twelve asked to help prepare for the multitude's meal ("Give them some food yourselves" Lk 9:13). They are to assist Jesus, the host who is among them as "one who serves" (Lk 22:28).

Finally, today we celebrate Father's Day. So here is my blessing for the fathers, grandfathers and all who have filled that role in our lives, from a book called: The Way of the Fathers: "The glory of fathers is in the holiness of their children."

JAIL MINISTRY

Reflection

May 31, 2021

Our visits with the incarcerated youth are always so uplifting because we get to faith share.

On this visit, we read and shared the upcoming Pentecost readings. We asked the young ladies what stood out for them from the readings. They said the words from the second reading, “*As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ.*” The young ladies that were present shared that they are there for each other, helping each other, because it is not easy being incarcerated.

One child, “Binky” (I made up this name), said that with her addictions she knew she would be in a worse situation if she was not locked up, and that she prayed and now thanks Jesus for bringing her back to juvenile hall. Binky shared that at thirteen years of age, she held her mom while her mom died in her arms; she says her younger sister witnessed her mom's death; her younger sister looks up to Binky and wants to be with Binky; but her younger sister is not allowed to be around Binky because “she is bad.” Binky cried while sharing and apologized for being so emotional, and said she is praying to Jesus to help her change to “show them” so that when she gets out, she will be able to be there for her younger sister. *This ministry is about being present and listening. Far from preaching to these children, many are hurting and there is healing when they are allowed the time to share their stories.*

On this same visit, another child shared that with Father's Day approaching, in the hall they were having a “Father and daughter” writing event for those that wanted to participate, and since she does not know her father and has never met him, she thought she would not be able to participate. However she realized that she does have a Father, *her Heavenly Father*, so she wrote and submitted a letter and was able to participate after all. This young lady, whom we have been able to accompany for some months now, amazes me with her strong and mature faith.

Again, I walked out with a grateful heart for this ministry, for the opportunity to share faith and to let the children know that God loves them so very much.



LA ABUNDANCIA DEL AMOR DE DIOS

La multitud que siguió a Jesús hasta el lugar desierto fue alimentada en cuerpo y espíritu. Jesús quería que supieran que en su presencia encontrarían atención y compasión. No les dejaría pasar hambre. Como Abram, que encontró a Dios en el pan y el vino ofrecidos por Melquisedec, experimentaron de primera mano la abundancia del amor de Dios. Estas comidas sagradas prefiguran la comida más profunda, la cena que compartieron Jesús y sus discípulos la noche antes de morir, la fiesta en la que compartimos la Eucaristía. Hoy celebramos la solemnidad del Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo. En este día, apreciamos de nuevo el gran amor de Jesucristo por nosotros y por el mundo y experimentamos de primera mano la presencia de Cristo en la sagrada cena.

TOMADO, BENDECIDO, ROTO, COMPARTIDO

Lo hacemos tan a menudo que podríamos darlo por sentado. En el desierto, con la multitud, y en la noche de la última cena, Jesús tomó el pan, dio gracias, dijo una oración de bendición, tomó el pan, lo partió y lo dio a los que tenían hambre de alimento físico y espiritual. Los estudiosos de las Escrituras y los teólogos nos recuerdan a menudo que debemos repetir las acciones de Jesús de tomar, bendecir, partir y dar -con nuestras vidas, recursos y dones- para que otros puedan conocer el amor de Cristo. Como personas eucarísticas, estamos destinados a cambiar, a parecernos más a Aquel a quien acogemos.

DENLE USTEDES MISMOS ALGO DE COMER

Observa que Jesús envió a sus discípulos a dar a la multitud la comida que necesitaban. Jesús podría haber hecho esto solo. Podríamos decir que no necesitaba que los discípulos participaran en la alimentación de la gran multitud. Pero Jesús no actuó solo entonces, y Cristo cuenta con nosotros ahora, para alimentar a los que tienen hambre y sed física, espiritual y emocional. Cuando nos cansamos y no queremos más que satisfacer nuestros impulsos egoístas y egocéntricos, es bueno que recordemos quiénes somos y de quiénes somos. Es crucial que oigamos en el fondo de nuestro corazón: "Denles ustedes de comer", y que estemos dispuestos a hacerlo. En esta solemnidad del Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo, celebremos la presencia viva de Cristo con y para nosotros y reconozcamos nuestra llamada a compartir esa presencia con los demás.
