In my first year of Seminary, the question that was asked endlessly the first couple of weeks was, "what's your call story?" The background being: you (precious little baby seminarian) have answered a call to serve God. I find theologian (and Presbyterian) Frederick Buechner gives meaning to what call means for us:

IT COMES FROM the Latin vocare, to call, and means the work a man is called to by God. There are all different kinds of voices calling you to all different kinds of work, and the problem is to find out which is the voice of God rather than of Society, say, or the Super-ego, or Self-Interest.

By and large a good rule for finding out is this. The kind of work God usually calls you to is the kind of work (a) that you need most to do and (b) that the world most needs to have done. If you really get a kick out of your work, you've presumably met requirement (a), but if your work is writing TV deodorant commercials, the chances are you've missed requirement (b). On the other hand, if your work is being a doctor in a leper colony, you have probably met requirement (b), but if most of the time you're bored and depressed by it, the chances are you have not only bypassed (a) but probably aren't helping your patients much either. Neither the hair shirt nor the soft berth will do.

## The place God calls you to is the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet.

Friends, my prayer for our church these days, is that we would find that place where our gladness and the world's hunger meet. And in that place, we may live out our calling as church here in Helotes. May it be so.

## June Session Highlights

The Session met in hybrid fashion (half online via Zoom, half in person in the Conference Room) on June 21, 2022, at 6:30 pm. Highlights included:

- 1. Rev. Walters offered an opening prayer and devotion using the words of Rev. Mr. Fred Rogers.
- 2. The following reports were given:
  - a. CLERK'S REPORT accepted transfer of membership of Nancy Fuller to FPC in Tomball.
  - b. TREASURER'S REPORT received by the Session.

#### c. ADMINISTRATION

• Finalized job descriptions for Session's approval; continue to work on the AV/TECH position and Pastor's. Sent to the Session recommendation of two new committees coming out from Administration to ease the work load.

#### d. CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

■ Having Children's Church in Choir Room is working; brought in more child appropriate furniture that does not disrupt Deb's use of the space. VBS is coming up in July, youth are heading to camp and the committee approved a CE Grant Policy and Application.

#### e. FELLOWSHIP AND CHURCH GROWTH

A graduate luncheon was held in May.

#### f. MISSION, OUTREACH, & SERVICE

 Debriefing on Cornyval took place May 17, 5 prayer quilts were dedicated in May, and \$251. 62 was collected for the Pentecost Special Offering.

#### g. WORSHIP

- A draft of the Worship Committee Description was reviewed. A cleaning day is set for June 26th. The Committee approved keeping Children's Church in the Choir Room permanently. Jason Hart is looking into restarting the Acolytes in worship.
- 3. In the Pastor's Report, Rev. Walters shared about Ministry Rally day taking place in August and the Session Retreat happening at our July meeting. Boundary training was completed in June by our staff; Rev. Walters is scheduled to take early in 2023. `

#### 4. The Session:

- after discussion and edits, approval of splitting the Administration into two new committees as recommended by Admin passed unanimously. The two new committees: Building and Grounds will focus on the property, rentals, utilities and such ministry and Administration will focus on the financial and personnel matters of FHPC's ministry.
- after discussion, approval of accepting the job descriptions for the Administrative Assistant and Sexton passed unanimously.
- received the report from the June Mission Presbytery Meeting, provided by Kay McCloskey.
- Moving forward, committees will be working on putting together Committee Descriptions to be approved by Session and put into the Manual of Operations.
- 5. Elder of the Month: June Saundra Davis, July Kay McCloskey.
- 6. Covenant concerns were shared and the meeting was closed with prayer.



## Reformation Sunday

October 30

On Reformation Sunday, observed the last Sunday in October, Presbyterians are reminded of their Reformed heritage, hearing once again how in 1517 Martin Luther nailed to the cathedral door in Wittenberg, Germany, his Ninety-five Theses. These theses, outlining what needed to change in the church, are credited to sparking a reformation that would change the religious landscape forever.

This Fall, we will be using a service created by my friend, the Rev. Carol Holbrook Prickett, pastor of Crescent Springs Presbyterian Church in Crescent Springs, Kentucky. She created this service to educate today's "reformers" — those Presbyterians in the pew — of the legacy of following a God who is always creating something new. A recent article interviewed Carol, who admitted to "really loving our Presbyterian confessions, as they give us the voices of our ancestors as they wrestled with faith in their time and place," used the model of a Christmas Lessons and Carols service, highlighting the confessions throughout and peppering them with background stories, hymns and prayers.

Prickett said she wrote "A Legacy of Faith: Reformation Lessons and Carols" to take people on "a journey through our own Reformed heritage, hoping that learning more about our past can give us strength for the future." "I think the confessions are an incredible gift to a church that is still wrestling today," she said. "So often we feel like we're the first generation to face upheaval and crisis, when we're really only the latest." I'm so excited to honor her work and our Reformed Tradition in worship this fall! - Pastor Katy






