The Twelve Days of Christmas



For those who are not aware, the 12 days of Christmas, or more accurately, of Christmastide, are the twelve days from Christmas Day to January 5, including those days. The song "The Twelve Days of Christmas," which is usually sung in the days leading up to Christmas, is a song that tradition says was a tool to teach Catholic children some of the tenets of the faith. The humorous song's purpose would go undetected by those who were severely persecuting the church and forbidding teaching Biblical truth. Therefore each day's gift had a symbolic meaning. For example, the partridge in a pear tree, symbolizes Jesus on the cross.

Today, January 3, is the tenth day of Christmas. In the song, the gift is **Ten Lords A-leaping.** In the days when the song was written it was the local Lords who established the laws in their own jurisdictions. From a symbolic point of view, the "Ten Lords" stand for the Ten Commandments recorded in Exodus 20.3-17. Although

there are 613 laws recorded in the first five books of the Old Testament, the Ten Commandments are the first ones and are lifted up of foremost importance. Although it is not prudent for us as Christ followers to expect non-Christians or non-Jews even, to accept the first four commandments which address loving God, it is reasonable to expect them to follow the remaining six which address ways we are to love others, beginning with honoring our parents. But, even these laws seem to fall on deaf ears. And so, the saying in the graphic is so true.

But as Jesus taught us, we need to examine ourselves, even before we examine or try to help others with their sin. Where do we stand on the Ten Commandments and on the commands in general to love God and to love others. The two are linked together reminding us that it is nearly impossible to do one without doing the other. If we do not love God, it is hard to fully love others. If we are not loving others, we are not loving God.

And so, on this tenth day of Christmastide, let us receive with rejoicing the gift of the ten lords aleaping, the Ten Commandments and the whole law of God. But let us also pray that the Holy Spirit will guide and direct us as we seek to be obedient to them in all that we do and say.
