## captive during one of the multiple wars between that nation and Pakistan. During his imprisonment, the Indian military personnel was allowed to read newspapers and listen to the radio. But, of course, only Pakistani sources. Those papers and stations which he was permitted to indulge reported regularly how badly India was losing, on all fronts.

Some time later, after the Indian officer had been released (into his *free* and *victorious* country-of-origin), he reflected that, despite all the propaganda he had been subjected to while in Pakistani custody, he had been certain, deep within his spirit, that his home nation had not, in fact, been losing the war. Something about the way the information was being reported, the lack of logic, the absence of substantial details, the way the Pakistani narrative didn't align with the Indian officer's own personal experience and knowledge –it all caused him to deeply disbelieve the version of events he was being subjected to. That's often what it can feel like to be a Christian living through the brokenness, darkness and hurt of a

dysfunctional world: we **KNOW** that **Jesus has already won the final battle** over sin and death, but all we seem to *HEAR* are the lies of The Enemy –telling us that that we aren't valuable, or that hate and division are more powerful than love and unity, or that our setbacks are permanent failures, or that convenience is more important than honesty and hard work, or that our enemies are beyond The LORD's Redeeming Grace and Power.

**But The LORD has told us differently.** We have the testimony of Scripture to guide our discipleship. We have the gift of The Holy Spirit to help us discern what is true and in-keeping with Christ's Character and Truth. We have the blessing of a church family to hold us accountable, encourage and strengthen us...

... on and on and on: our faith gives us so many tools to avoid being discouraged and deceived!

So, if you're ever struggling with despair, please remember that the real news is The Good News of Jesus Christ

"I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your

heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his

body, the fullness of him who fills all in all." -Ephesians 1:17-23 (NRSV)
