I THESSALONIANS

Part Twenty Two: "What To Do When You'd Rather Be Somewhere Else"

I Thessalonians 3:1-2

Wherefore when we could no longer forbear, we thought it good to be left at Athens alone; And sent Timotheus, our brother, and minister of God, and our fellowlabourer in the gospel of Christ, to establish you, and to comfort you concerning your faith:

Observations on this part of Paul's Second Missionary Journey:

1) These verses, along with Acts 17:10-18:5, help us to <u>piece</u> together the Thessalonica/Berea/Athens/Corinth part of Paul's journey.

- 1. Paul leaves Berea, while Silas and Timothy stay. Acts 17:14.
- 2. Some of the brethren take Paul to Athens. Acts 17:15.

3. When they arrive at Athens, Paul sends these brethren back to Berea bearing a letter to Silas and Timothy telling them to come to Athens. Acts 17:15.

4. While Paul waits for them to arrive at Athens, he teaches in the synagogue and the market place. Acts 17:16-17.

5. Silas and Timothy arrive in Athens, and Paul sends them back to Macedonia: Timothy went to Thessalonica, and perhaps Silas did too, though it is more likely that he went somewhere else in Macedonia, perhaps Berea, which is why Acts 18:5 refers to the entire region. I Thess. 3:1-2.

6. Paul continues in Athens (I Thess. 3:1), then he proceeds to Corinth. Acts 17:33-18:1.

7. Silas and Timothy return from Macedonia and reunite with Paul at Corinth. Acts 18:5.

2) I Thessalonians 2:17-18 tells us what is going on in Paul's <u>mind</u> and <u>heart</u> while he is in Berea and Athens.

3) While Paul was preaching one of his most famous sermons, he would have <u>preferred</u> to be in Thessalonica.

What To Do When You Are Forced To Be Somewhere You Would Rather Not Be

- 1) Care about people where you are. Acts 17:16.
- 2) <u>Represent Christ</u> where you are. Acts 17:17-18.
- 3) Obey God where you are. Acts 17:19-22.
