A. Paul's Faithfulness. 1-12.

- 1. Paul's Boldness. 1-2.
 - a. Evidenced by his entrance.
 - 1) Not <u>hidden</u>. For yourselves, brethren, know our entrance in unto you
 - 2) Not wasted. that it was not in vain
 - b. Evidenced by his <u>resilience</u>.
 - 1) After <u>physical</u> suffering at Philippi. even after that we had suffered before
 - 2) After humiliating <u>injustice</u> by the government. *and were shamefully entreated*
 - c. Evidenced by his preaching.
 - 1) It was Spirit-filled. we were bold in our God
 - 2) It was simple and straightforward. to speak unto you the gospel of God
 - 3) It was in spite of opposition. with much contention

GREAT TRUTHS

- 1. Reminding people of your track record is appropriate when it helps to edify others.
- 2. Perseverance in the face of adversity gives you <u>credibility</u> with your hearers.
- 3. Boldness is a manifestation of being filled with the Holy Spirit.
