Hi Chris and Katherine,

Jeanne did not forward to me the finished cleaned up version of the RFP, instead she returned to me the track changes version in word. It included Katherine's comments too. Anyway, I had e-mailed Jeanne back and commented on the fact that the RFP history and significance section may *partially* satisfy Section 106 (probably due to an ACOE 404 permit), but the intent and format of an HSR is quite different than 106 review.

I also commented on the need to include the potential significance of the trestle in the RFP. In addition to the trestle being a contributor to the downtown district (informally in that I do not remember Don Napoli calling it out as such...but that oversight does not mean it is a non-contributor) it also appears **eligible** for the National Register as an individual linear resource property. This makes it significant and as such must be treated as a historical resource under CEQA. Do wonder what Cassandra Chattan's conclusions were in her resource evaluation that is cited in the RFP? I assume she found the trestle eligible for the NR, right? Katherine, do you have a copy of that report? **The potential for individual significance should be indicated in the RFP too, so the future consultant knows they are working with an eligible property.**

This pdf version is frustrating since one cannot make changes to it.
