



# Dear Padre,

I care for my mother, who has dementia. I was active in my parish, but now I hardly have a minute to spare for prayer, much less helping out at church. I'm getting very depressed. What should I do?

have several ideas. First, make your prayer life part of your mother's routine, and you'll find it easier to fit prayer into your day. People with dementia find it soothing to listen to repetitive prayer, so consider praying the rosary aloud in her presence. Sometimes people with advanced dementia can still remember and recite the Our Father and the Hail Mary, so you could end up praying the rosary together. That would truly be a gift.

Next, try reading aloud Scripture stories from a youth Bible. They'll be easier for her to understand than passages from an adult Bible, and you'll get some time with God's word.

Last, but absolutely not least, it's important for you to be connected. If your parish has a parish nurse, he or she can help you find respite care, in which someone takes your place with your mom so you can get away for a while, or

a caregiver-support group where you can talk with other people in your situation. If your parish doesn't have a nurse, your diocese can give you the same information.

Remember, attending to your spiritual health doesn't just help you—it helps your mother, too.

#### **NEW STAFF APPOINTMENT**

You may recall reading in the bulletin over Pentecost that Vince Zaprzal, our Director of Parish Ministries, Religious Education, & Facilities wrote about his resignation effective July 1st. Since that time, the Holy Spirit indeed provided for us here at Ascension of another great person that we can welcome to the Ascension of Our Lord Parish family.

I am pleased to announce to you that **Deacon Michael (Mick) Ruddle** has accepted the position as full-time Director of Parish Ministries, Religious Education, and Facilities. Deacon Mick comes to Ascension with 14 years of ministerial experience from Saint Matthew Parish of Glendale Heights where he has served in a similar staff position. He was ordained to the Permanent Diaconate with the class of 2016. He will remain serving as Deacon at St. Matthew's as that is also his home parish. Prior to parish work, Deacon Mick worked in telecommunications.

#### PROTOCOL UPDATE



#### ENJOYING TOGETHERNESS AGAIN

**Flag Day**, also called **National Flag Day**, in the United States, a day honoring the national flag, observed on June 14.

The holiday commemorates the date in 1777 when the United States approved the design for its first national flag.

In 1916 Pres. Woodrow Wilson proclaimed June 14 as the official date for Flag Day, and in 1949 the U.S. Congress permanently established the date as National Flag Day. Although Flag Day is not an official federal holiday. Each year the U.S. president delivers an address that proclaims the week of June 14 as National Flag Week, and all Americans are encouraged to fly U.S. flags during that week.



#### Religious Freedom Week 2021: Solidarity in Freedom

<u>June 28 - Christians in Iraq</u> - Pray for Christians in Iraq, and that people of all faiths in the land of Abraham may live in peace.
