BE SAFE AT THE GATE

Drop Off

- Use the ENTRANCE and EXIT driveways correctly.
- Children get out of the car quickly.

Pick Up

- _ DO NOT park illegally on yellow lines, across driveways, on the footpath OR on the grass verge. Drivers cannot see your children.
- SLOW DOWN
- DO NOT call out to your child from your car encouraging them to run across the road to get in the car. DANGEROUS!!!!! USE the patrolled pedestrian crossing outside the front of the school.

Please park down the road and walk to the school gate.

LATE ARRIVALS / EARLY PICK UP

Being organized and having your child arrive at school on time helps reduce classroom interruptions and distractions allowing teachers to focus on teaching lessons to all students. We understand there are times when it is necessary for your child to leave school early. Wherever possible make appointments outside of school hours. Student attendance, along with effective teaching, has the greatest influence on student engagement and achievement. All students must be present at school so they can participate and engage in learning.

Regular and prompt attendance is essential to the academic success of students.


