<u>Machinists, Call for 100%</u> <u>Buy America Defense</u> <u>Products</u>

On June 7, 2018 Machinists and <u>Sen. Murphy</u> call for 100% Buy America Defense Products. The Machinists are joining U.S. Sen. Chris Murphy (CT) in a push to increase to 100% Buy America provisions for defense products made for the military.

The amendment to the National Defense Authorization Act, or NDAA, would bolster economic and national security and create good, middle-class jobs.

TAKE ACTION: Call your Senators at 202 -224-3121 and ask that they support Sen. Murphy's 100 percent Buy America amendment.

"The Machinists Union applauds Sen. Murphy for taking this step to ensure that our tax dollars used on defense are spent as they should be on products manufactured with 100 percent domestic content produced by U.S. workers here at home," said IAM International President Bob Martinez. "Sen. Murphy's amendment would help ensure that our tax dollars are used to support the U.S. workforce and the firms who employ them. Both parties should join Sen. Murphy in supporting U.S. workers and demand that 100 percent of goods purchased for defense procurement are manufactured in the United States."

Murphy's amendment would not only create jobs, but also protect national security by defending the supply chain for our major defense programs against foreign disruptions.

"When we spend taxpayer money, we should spend it here helping local jobs and boosting our economy," said Murphy. "If we want to support U.S. manufacturing jobs and make sure our military has safe and secure products, we should make everything in America."

Our <u>International President, Bob Martinez</u>, started the conference off and spoke of what a good year we had in organizing saying "it is the best in 20 years and we need to keep it up."

<u>International President Martinez</u> said what we did in the budget for military spending is going to keep a lot of machinists working for years to come. This is true especially here in Connecticut. He also spoke of the Missouri fight to appeal Right To Work on the ballot there. We need to make sure we get out the vote in November or we may become a right to work for less state also.

We had many great speakers from the congressional leaders from the House and the Senate at our conference including <u>Rosa DeLauro</u>, <u>Steny Hoyer</u>, <u>Elizabeth Warren</u>, <u>Nancy Pelosi</u> and raising star <u>Tim Ryan</u> from Ohio and many more. All spoke of what we can get done if we win in the mid-terms and in 2020. They are ready to govern. But we need to get out the vote in November to make this happen.

# <u>Collective Bargaining</u> <u>Under Attack</u>

A U.S. Supreme Court case called Janus v. AFSCME Council 31 threatens our union and all working families.

This case aims to take away the freedom of working people to join together in strong unions to speak up for themselves and their communities. A decision is expected by the summer.

#### What is this case really about?

The case aims to erode the freedom to form unions to improve our lives and the communities we serve. Real freedom is about making a decent living from our hard work; it's also about having time to take a loved one to the doctor, attend a parent-teacher conference and retire in dignity. The corporate special interests behind this case do not believe that working people should have the freedom to negotiate a fair return on their work.

#### Who is behind this case?

The National Right to Work Foundation is part of a network funded by corporate billionaires to use the courts to rig the rules against working people. For decades, these wealthy elites have used their massive fortunes to gain outsized influence to chip away at the progress unions have won for all working families. Now they want the highest court in the land to take away our freedom to come together to protect what our communities need: a living wage, retirement security, health benefits, the ability to care for loved ones and more.

#### What is the real impact of this case?

If we lose this case the entire Fifty States coast to coast and all the public workers will become right to work. Why does this matter to you because you are not a public worker? In the last Legislative session in CT there were 136 right to work bills presented to the legislative body, so you can't do anything about the Supreme Court case but you can see where your political candidate stands on this important issue before you vote in the election this fall.

## **June Monthly Report**

**Workers Compensation** 

Reporting your work connected injury immediately is very important for several reasons. The first reason for timely investigation of the incident is with a Union Safety Representative to prevent the injury from happening again to you or someone else. The second reason is your workers compensation benefits might be held up by the company while they investigate the incidents.

The company has entered into a practice of holding up your workers compensation claim when you get injured. Why? Because they say they need to investigate the incident first. This practice causes members to have to wait 2-3 weeks before treatment of the injury. So the company is allowing you to suffer in pain before you get the MRI, physical therapy or some other treatment recommended from your treating physician.

What they say is they need all the accident reports from EH&S before they can process the claim. This is another tack from the companies agents to discourage people from reporting an injury and putting it on your own insurance.

So please report your injury immediately. Then when you return to your work area tell your supervisor when the injury investigation is going to happen with your Union safety Representative. Do not say anything about your injury without a Union Safety Representative present. How do I find out more about Workers Compensation? You can go to the new Local Lodge 700 web site <u>iam700.org</u> in the near future. Until then while the web site is under construction, so please contact a Shop Steward or a Union Safety Representative and we will guide you in the proper direction. The Form <u>30C</u> "NOTICE OF CLAIM FOR COMPEN-SATION (EMPLOYEE TO COMMISSIONER AND TO EMPLOYER)" is to be completed and filed by a claimant (employee) or claimant's attorney/ representative for making a claim for workers' compensation benefits. The Form <u>30C</u> includes a map of Connecticut's 169 cities and towns and their respective workers' compensation districts, as well as instructions for completing and filing this form and a listing of district office contact information.
