Independence Day Collect: Father of all nations and ages, we recall the day when our country claimed its place among the family of nations; for what has been achieved we give you thanks, for the work that still remains we ask your help, and as you have called us from many peoples to be one nation, grant that, under your providence, our country may share your blessings with all the peoples of the earth. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son. The Roman Missal

Saint Anthony pursued a brief career in medicine, but felt called to minister to broken souls. In Milan he founded the Angelical Sisters of Saint Paul and the Clerics Regular of Saint Paul (the Barnabites). He died in 1539 at the age of thirty-seven. Magnificat

Saint Elizabeth as queen, she was diligent in prayer and almsgiving; her loving ministrations won over her harsh husband and her rebellious son, she averted both civil war and family bloodshed; she was widowed, and she became a Franciscan tertiary and devoted her life to the poor; known as "the Peacemaker" she died in 1336. Magnificat

Saint Maria Goretti was born to Italian farmers in 1890; she was not yet twelve years old when a nineteen-year-old, Alessandro, attempted to rape her; she protested concerned more about her rapist's purity than her own earthly life; Alessandro stabbed her fourteen times; he was eight years into a thirty-year prison sentence when Maria came to him in a dream, offering a lily. He was present during her canonization process in 1950. Magnificat

Saint Augustine and Companions are a group of 120 martyrs which includes thirty-three European missionaries and eighty-seven Chinese, ranging in age from nine to seventy-six. Their collective witness over three centuries is one of great courage and joy amid cruel tortures. Fourteen-year-old Anna Wang was the last of a group of women and children to be martyred; on October 1, 2000, she was canonized with the other Chinese Martyrs by Pope John Paul II. Magnificat

Brothers and Sisters,

On this 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time our readings give us much to think about as to what as Christians our “mission” is. In a very poetic way, the prophet Isaiah calls upon the people of Israel to rejoice and be glad, for they will come to know the joy and the fulfillment of the promises of God. Prosperity, peace and comfort are the promises they shall see and come to know. In our 2nd reading Paul uses the example of his own life when he reminds the Galatians that what is truly important is to understand the relevance of the cross of Jesus Christ for one’s life. Paul boasts the cross of Jesus has led to a new creation. Today’s gospel reminds us of the high level of commitment in Jesus’ community of disciples. In all three synoptic gospels, Jesus sends out the 12 apostles, but only in the gospel of St Luke do we have this second sending of the 72 disciples. The number 72 was thought to be the total number of nations on earth. They were to bring peace, cure the sick and proclaim “the kingdom of God is at hand” to all.



Luke in comparing the directives to the 72 disciples with the commissioning of the 12 apostles, we can see some differences as well as some points of contact. The 12 are given authority over demons and the ability to cure diseases. They are also charged with proclaiming the good news. These 12 apostles are sent out alone. The 72 disciples, on the other hand, travel in pairs as they bring the good news to households and towns. They too are told to cure the sick, but Jesus says nothing about driving out demons; yet they are able to do so too. In chapter 9 of Luke’s gospel, Jesus sent the apostles out on a mission. Today he extends that ministry, to proclaim the good news, as he sends the 72 out to prepare for his future coming. Today’s missionary effort foreshadows the mission to the Gentiles in the Acts of the Apostles (also written by Luke). As we have said earlier the number of disciples is significant. The number 72 represents all the nations of the world and they represent the universal mission of Jesus to the entire world. There will never be enough missionaries to reach out to the entire world, and thus today’s gospel represents the universal mission of Jesus to the entire world.

As the 72 were sent out, they were given instructions for their mission. They were to rely completely on God for strength, sustenance and protection. Delaying was to be avoided, as their mission was urgent (“the harvest is abundant but the laborers are few...”). Disciples were to willingly accept the generosity and hospitality of others. They were to eat whatever was provided, thereby ignoring Jewish food laws. They were to witness by their lives and by proclaiming God’s word. They were to move on if they were rejected. The only possession the missionary was to take with him was *shalom, peace*. Shalom is evidence of God’s reign. It is the same peace offered to humanity at the creation of the world. It is a sign of perfect union and harmony with God. Final thought: The mission of Christians is never a case of going where we want to go, but of going where we are called to go. Shalom.

SYNOD PROCESS IN OUR PARISH

From Pope Francis and Bishops: A Synodal Church, in announcing the Gospel, "journeys together." How is this "journeying together" happening today in our parish and diocese? What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our "journeying together?"

From February to the end of March, Synod Parish Listening Sessions were held; the Synod Parish Synthesis was compiled and submitted to the Diocese on May 27, 2022. It is available for viewing on St Catherine's website www.stcofa.org after July 11, 2022.

We thank everyone that took the time to participate in the Synod Process.

In this process, there were three fundamental pillars of reflection:

Communion: We are "diverse peoples of one faith," "The communion we share finds its deepest roots in the love and unity of the Trinity."

We acknowledged that it is not just about different cultures, different languages, it is also about Seniors, youth, kiddos, divorcees, LGBTQ, deaf community, families, etc.,

Participation: based on the fact that all the faithful are qualified and are called to serve one another through the gifts they have each received from the Holy Spirit.

Through these sessions we listened to the talents that are not being shared in our parish, and they desire to share but they need guidance where/how/what.

Mission: to witness the love of God in the midst of the whole human family.

We listened that Prayer is key to our Faith and consensus that the role of the family in fostering faith is paramount. Requests were heard asking for teaching of the faith, to be able to better understand the Mass and the Sacraments.

Overall, during the Synod process there was a positive sense from attendees of gratitude for the listening sessions, that we had the opportunity to come together as a community and to meet and share with one another...we want to do more of this in our parish.

Phase 1 process has taken place and has been recorded...guiding us on what steps to take; let us pray as we journey into Phase 2 taking action on what was heard - more to come soon.

AN EXCERPT FROM THE SYNOD OF BISHOPS PREPARATORY DOCUMENT...we recall that the purpose of the Synod, and therefore of this consultation, is not to produce documents, but "to plant dreams, draw forth prophecies and visions, allow hope to flourish, inspire trust, bind up wounds, weave together relationships, awaken a dawn of hope, learn from one another and create a bright resourcefulness that will enlighten minds, warm hearts, give strength to our hands."




FAITH FORMATION IS SEEKING NEW CATECHISTS



SÍNODO EN NUESTRA PARROQUIA

Del Papa Francisco y los Obispos: una Iglesia Sinodal, al anunciar el Evangelio, "camina junta". ¿Cómo está sucediendo este "caminar juntos" hoy en la Iglesia local? ¿Qué pasos nos invita el Espíritu Santo a dar para crecer en nuestro "caminar juntos"?

Desde febrero hasta finales de marzo se realizaron las sesiones de escucha en nuestra parroquia; la Síntesis Parroquial del Sínodo se compiló y envió a la diócesis el 27 de mayo de 2022. Estará disponible para su visualización en el sitio web de St Catherine, www.stcofa.org después del 11 de julio de 2022.

Agradecemos a todos los que se tomaron el tiempo para participar.

En este proceso hubo tres pilares fundamentales de reflexión:

Comunión: Somos "pueblos distintos, pero con una misma fe", "La comunión que compartimos encuentra sus raíces más profundas en el amor y en la unidad de la Trinidad".

Reconocemos que no se trata solo de diferentes culturas, diferentes idiomas, también se trata de personas mayores, jóvenes, niños, divorciados, LGBTQ, comunidad de sordos, familias, etc.

Participación: basada en el hecho de que todos los fieles están calificados y son llamados a servirse recíprocamente a través de los dones que cada uno ha recibido del Espíritu Santo.

A través de estas sesiones escuchamos los talentos que no están siendo compartidos en nuestra parroquia, y ellos desean compartir pero necesitan orientación dónde/cómo/qué.

Misión: testimoniar el amor de Dios en medio de toda la familia humana.

Escuchamos que la oración es clave para nuestra fe y coincidimos en que el papel de la familia en el fomento de la fe es primordial. Se escucharon pedidos de enseñanza de la fe, para poder comprender mejor la Misa y los Sacramentos.

En general, durante el proceso del Sínodo hubo una sensación positiva de gratitud por parte de los asistentes por las sesiones de escucha, que tuvimos la oportunidad de reunirnos como comunidad y de reunirnos y compartir unos con otros...queremos hacer más de esto en nuestra parroquia.

El proceso de la Fase 1 ha tenido lugar y ha sido grabado... guiándonos sobre los pasos a seguir; oremos mientras seguimos a la Fase 2 tomando medidas sobre lo que se escuchó; pronto habrá más por venir.

UN EXTRACTO DEL DOCUMENTO PREPARATORIO DEL SÍNODO DE LOS OBISPOS... Colecta del Día de la Independencia: Padre de todas las naciones y de todas las épocas, recordamos el día en que nuestra patria reclamó su lugar en la familia de las naciones; por lo que se ha logrado te damos gracias, por el trabajo que aún queda te pedimos ayuda, y como nos has llamado de entre muchos pueblos a ser una sola nación, haz que, bajo tu providencia, nuestra patria comparta tus bendiciones con todos los pueblos de la tierra. Por nuestro Señor Jesucristo, tu Hijo. El Misal Romano

San Antonio hizo una breve carrera de medicina, pero se sintió llamado a atender a las almas rotas. En Milán fundó las Hermanas Angélicas de San Pablo y los Clérigos Regulares de San Pablo (los Barnabitas). Murió en 1539 a la edad de treinta y siete años. Magnificat

Santa Isabel como reina, fue diligente en la oración y en la limosna; sus amorosas ministraciones ganaron a su duro marido y a su rebelde hijo, evitó tanto la guerra civil como el derramamiento de sangre en la familia; enviudó, y se hizo terciaria franciscana y dedicó su vida a los pobres; conocida como "la Pacificadora" murió en 1336. Magnificat

Santa María Goretti nació en 1890 en el seno de unos campesinos italianos; no tenía aún doce años cuando un joven de diecinueve, Alessandro, intentó violarla; ella protestó preocupada más por la pureza de su violador que por su propia vida terrenal; Alessandro la apuñaló catorce veces; llevaba ocho años de condena a treinta años de prisión cuando María se le presentó en sueños, ofreciéndole un lirio. Estuvo presente en su proceso de canonización en 1950. Magnificat

San Agustín y sus compañeros son un grupo de 120 mártires que incluye a treinta y tres misioneros europeos y ochenta y siete chinos, con edades comprendidas entre los nueve y los setenta y seis años. Su testimonio colectivo a lo largo de tres siglos es de gran valor y alegría en medio de crueles torturas. Anna Wang, de catorce años, fue la última de un grupo de mujeres y niños en ser martirizada; el 1 de octubre de 2000 fue canonizada con los demás mártires chinos por el Papa Juan Pablo II. Magnificat
