





October is a huge month in the DAP By William J. Bryan, National Director

October might just be the busiest month in the Drug Awareness Program! Red Ribbon Week is October 23-31, and October is also Youth Substance Use Prevention Month and Substance Misuse Prevention Month.

Hopefully, your Lodge has planned at least one activity to recognize this important month. If you don't know what to do, contact your State Association's DAP Chair for some exciting activities.

October was first declared as National Substance Abuse Prevention Month in 2011. Since then, October has been a time to highlight the vital role of substance abuse prevention in both individual and community health, to remember those who have lost their lives to substance abuse, and to acknowledge those in recovery, as well as children, parents, family, and friends supporting them.

Studies show that the earlier an individual starts smoking, drinking, or using other drugs, the greater the likelihood of developing an addiction. Nine out of 10 people who abuse or are addicted to nicotine, alcohol, or other drugs began using these substances before they were 18. People who began using addictive substances before age 15 are nearly seven times more likely to develop a substance problem than those who delay first use until age 21 or older. Every year that substance use is delayed during the period of adolescent brain development, the risk of addiction and substance abuse decreases.

If your Lodge has a Halloween party for kids, consider combining your activity with a Drug Awareness activity. Again, your State Association's Chair has a wealth of ideas for you to consider. If you think Halloween is scary, think how scary the drug problem is in your community!

Lastly, now is the time to think about submitting a law enforcement officer from your community for the Enrique S. Camarena Award.
