Printed on an 8.5x11'' sheet of paper. Only poems written in English can be judged. Foreign phrases are only acceptable with a translation provided. Poems can be in free verse or rhymed, in a traditional form or contemporary.
- 3. Poems must use a consistent concept that addresses the theme.
- 4. Posters cannot be digital, must not exceed 11" x 17", be student's original, creative artwork, including illustrations, images or quotations. Depictions of TV, video games, or other recreations of past poster designs do not constitute creativity or originality. Any non-smearable medium is acceptable (markers, crayons, pencils paints, etc.). No posters with loose or hanging materials will be accepted.
- 5. One poem with poster per student. Please attach the poem to the poster with a paperclip upon submission. No group projects. Judging will be done by the Monroe County Bar Association. **The committee will select 3 winners from each level.**
