February 18, 2005 Juice celebrated another birthday! Many fans wrote in with their well wishes for Juice on her day. The wishes were sent on to Juice on her birthday and they were posted to the JNFC's website too!

A JUICE NEWTON FLASH BACK!!!

The year is 1985 and Juice is busy selecting songs for an album that was being billed as to be a “big” project. Juice and Otha Young listened to thousands of songs before selecting 10 for the new album.

This album would be Juice’s second since her return to RCA records. Now that the songs had been selected, it was time to start putting the pieces together and record these songs. This wasn’t an easy task as Juice is particular about her craft.

One song that was difficult to record was, “You Make Me Want To Make You Mine.” Juice once said to Lee Arnold of the syndicated radio show “On A Country Road, “Songs have building blocks and we just could not find the handle for the opening of that tune. So Richard (Landis producer at the time) changed the intro to an acoustic guitar and it fell into place. **That was the first time I think I have ever recorded a song twice in order to get it.**”

That song “You Make Me Want To Make You Mine” was released before the album. The song was climbing the charts in the summer of 1985. In fact, that song went to number one on the charts and it was Juice’s second number one country hit. Her first number one country hit was “The Sweetest Thing (I’ve Ever Known)” written by Otha Young.

After the success of the first single, it was time for the second release from the album and the release of the album itself. The second single release was called “Hurt” and it too quickly climbed the charts. Juice hadn’t sounded so committed to a deep emotional song since “Break It To Me Gently.”

Soon it was time for the album to be released. Before that, she needed a title. The song “Old Flame” was selected as the title cut. The song was written by Mr. Reed Nielsen who has co-wrote some songs with Otha Young including “Eye of A Hurricane” on the “Can’t Wait All Night” album.

The album had a world premiere on the radio. This was an interview with Juice as all the tracks were played one by one. The point of this was to give the listener a better understanding of Juice Newton and what her musical take was.

The “Old Flame” album was a country hit reaching number twelve on Billboards album chart. The album spawned five singles and one single that was added later to the album in its second printing.

The song that was added was Juice's duet with the late Eddie Rabbitt. The title of the song was "Both To Each Other (Friends & Lovers)." This replaced "Let Your Woman Take Care of You" on the original track listing of "Old Flame."

The duet could also be found on Eddie's album "Rabbitt Tracks." The duet went to number one on the country charts. This was Juice's first recorded duet although she had worked with Eddie before.

Last year Juice was asked what her favorite album she had ever recorded was. Juice answered, "Old Flame because of all the hits from it." Who can argue with that? This album contained 3 number one songs and all the rest of the singles were in the top 5 and top 10.

Although this album is out of print today, it can be found on Ebay and some specialty record stores. This was truly a classic album recorded by a classy lady with a fabulous talent.

Growing Pains

The JNFC has been experiencing some growing pains on the website. Unfortunately, the forum section of the website had to be discontinued due to incompatibility reasons. However, there is a forum you can write a concert review to or ask another fan a question.
