It is hard to believe that we are nearing the halfway mark of Lent.

Not just because the clock ticks too quickly at times, nor because of how hectic both our ministry and personal schedules all have been; but rather, because of the convergence of our Lenten Theme and events local, national and global.

It seems as though, repeatedly, mere moments after we've discussed what it means (and reaffirmed our commitment to be) a FEARLESSLY FAITHFUL people, another tragedy or anxiety-inducing situation

immediately arises. But, fear not: this is to be expected. Living in this world means having to contend with its fallen nature, and that means that we will have to endure trauma and trial; tribulation and tearful circumstances. However, these too are occasions to embrace our "F⁷" faith and find meaning, order, purpose amidst the seemingly insurmountable chaos. We are privileged with the power to pen different narratives than our woeful and angst-ridden culture seems trapped into repeating. We are called and empowered by The LORD to write an alternative story from the deathly tendencies of society.

Where some people feed off of (and are sadly are enslaved to) the cycle of negativity and terror, we are caught-up in GOD's hope-filled cycle of confession, repentance and restoration. Even when things look pretty scary, we know that they are not insurmountably so.

Yes: even though our Savior was betrayed, arrested, cruelly humiliated, punished, and, ultimately, unjustly executed. However, that wasn't the end of the story, was it?

No. We serve a King of an upside-down kingdom –one where humility, self-sacrifice, and service actually serve our self-interest (meaning: they preserve our souls, honor Christ, bless others and bring about GOD's Realm and Reign).

In the oft-remembered words of Rev. Fred Rogers (aka: "Mr. Rogers"), "When I was a boy and I would see scary things in the news, my mother would say to me, 'Look for the helpers. You will

always find people who are helping.'*

And to this, I would add: "If you don't *see* any helpers. **be** one."



Our 2018 theme for Lent is **"F7: FEARLESS FAITH** (Fearlessly Facing-our-failings and Forging Forward in Faith toward Final Fulfillment)".

For our Lenten prayer and study disciplines, we will have available the devotional booklet "LIVING THE GOSPEL LIFE: THE SEASON OF LENT". The daily devotions in this booklet highlight the concepts of being sent, demonstrating faith in action, and being mission-minded each day of Lent. Suggested activities are associated with preparing our hearts, souls and minds to reflect on the suffering, death and resurrection of Christ and his mission for us.

For our teens we will have available "<u>THE ACT OF LENT</u>". This booklet of Lenten devotions for teens and young adults first puts attention on the loving action God took to claim us as his own and then on our active response to God's saving grace. Daily action-themed Scripture and activity prompts accompany each reflection.

Lastly, for our children we will have "<u>JESUS LOVES ME!</u>". These 47 devotions for children ages 6-12 and their families each highlight the saving love and daily guidance we receive from our Good Shepherd, Jesus, who lovingly leads us throughout our lives past the cross and toward the promise of life everlasting. The 23rd Psalm and other biblical shepherd stories help children learn of Jesus' ever-present love.

On this Sunday, we encourage you to wear your camp shirts to this worship! We will also have Summer Camp packets and online registration information for anyone interested!







Dar Wellman-Dorsey will once again be doing a summer reading readiness program. The program will be held from <u>June 12 thru August 17</u>, and will be housed at Richville United Church of Christ. All kids in Kindergarten, 1st and 2nd Grade can sign up (<u>NO preschool age</u>).

The program offers sight words, phonics, worksheets, spelling, oral reading, comprehension, listening/following directions, parts of speech, creative writing, games/puzzles, music and much more! Learn basic skills to enter the next grade, review information to succeed when returning to school in the fall, and advance your child's knowledge in basic reading and language skills.

Sessions focus on individual/one on one tutoring, not groups. The cost is \$200 for 10 sessions. You may pay all the cost at once or choose to pay monthly. Each session takes place once a week, and is one hour long. There is also a \$20 registration fee per child for a workbook and supplies.
