

## Discussion and Vote on the proposed By-Law and House Rules Changes to be taken at the Lodge Meeting on Tuesday May 16th

## PROPOSED BY LAW AND HOUSE RULE CHANGES 2023

\*Pronoun changes will be automatically done by Grand Lodge.

\*Grand Lodge has approved our current language of adding Secretary and Treasurer to the Board of Directors.

\*The Secretary shall also report to the Grand Secretary all expulsions and suspensions of Members, giving the name, age, birthplace, residence and occupation. The Secretary shall be required to give bond to the Lodge in the sum of \$5,000.00 for the faithful performance of their duties.

\*The Treasurer shall present a report at each regular meeting showing the condition of the funds of the Lodge. The Treasurer shall be required to give bond to the Lodge in the sum of \$5,000.00 for the faithful performance of their duties.

Section 1. The Lodge, by an affirmative secret ballot of two-thirds of those present at a regular Lodge meeting, may elect a Member in good standing to Life Membership upon the payment in advance of 25times the annual regular Lodge dues as set forth in Article X. The Lodge, by an affirmative secret ballot of two-thirds of those present at a regular Lodge meeting, may elect a Member in good standing to Life Membership who has paid to a Lodge or Lodges required annual dues for a period of not less than 30 years preceding application, and who shall have attained the age of not less than 65 years. (Minimum age no longer required)

The Auditing & Accounting Committee shall:1. Be charged with making all arrangements for completion and submission of the Lodge's Annual Financial Report to Grand Lodge and all required governmental agencies by \*June 15th Change to August 1st for all entities of the Lodge whose fiscal year ends March 31st, in accordance with Sec. 13.040 of the Laws of the Order and the provisions of the Grand Lodge Auditing, Accounting & Management Manual.

Secure a financial report of any other entity affiliated with the Lodge, having a fiscal year ending other than \*March 31st, within sixty days Change to 15 days after tax return is submitted no later \*than April 15<sup>th</sup> the close of that fiscal year

- (c) LIFE MEMBERSHIP In addition to the amounts set forth under (a) above, each Life Member and/or \*Honorary Life Member shall pay \$\frac{\$57.00}{\$}\$ Change to \frac{1}{2}\$ basic lodge dues towards Lodge administration expense.
- \*3(d) No guests are allowed in our Club after 6:00 p.m. Change to 7:00 PM on Meeting Night Tuesday, except on special occasions or employees on duty. Exceptions
- \*can be made by approval of the Board of Directors or the direction of the Lodge. Add: Members with Mobility issues who require personal care or the assistance of a driver to get to the Lodge shall be exempt.
- \*3(f) All persons 21 years of age must be accompanied by the host Member while in the Game Room. (We no longer have a game room)
- \*13(a) Reservations in the Lounge on Friday and Saturday may be made for parties of eight four or more. Reservations will be held no longer than 15 minutes past the reservation time. Reservations shall be made with the Club Manager, Office, or Bartender.
- \*3(f) Add: Smoking of Marijuana or any Cannabis including Vaping Products, is strictly Prohibited on any Lodge Property, including the Lodge Parking Lot.

Vote and Discussion to be held on Tuesday May 16<sup>th</sup>/

These next 2 items are currently not being adhered to but are in our CURRENT by laws and will not be voted on the floor. The committee recommends we immediately implement these 2 items.

Section 1. The fee for initiation in this Lodge for an applicant who has passed his twenty-sixth birthday shall be \$25.00, \$10.00 to accompany the proposition (application), and the balance to be paid when the candidate presents himself for initiation.

Section 1. There shall be no fee for initiation in this Lodge for an applicant making an application prior to his twenty-sixth birthday.

These changes will be published in the next newsletter to inform us of the date for voting. Members will vote on the floor 2 weeks after to discuss and vote to accept these changes.
