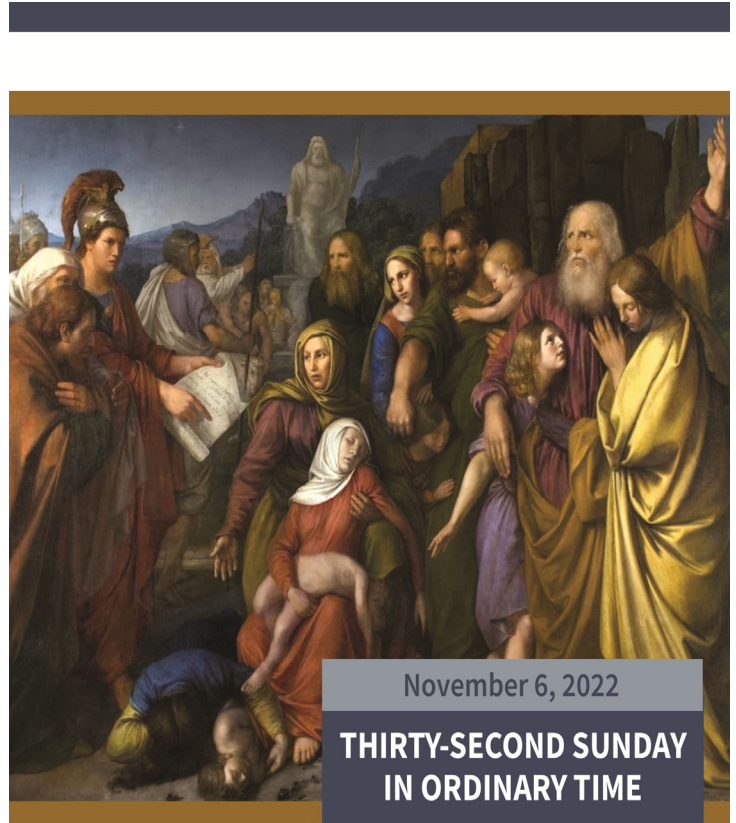

LITURGY CORNER

November 6 - THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

- November 9 - THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA
November 10 - St. Leo the Great, Pope & Doctor of the Church
November 11 - St. Martin of Tours, Bishop
November 12 - St. Josaphat, Bishop & Martyr

Basilica of Saint John Lateran, in the year 313 the Roman Emperor Constantine declared the Edict of Milan, granting religious freedom to Christians, and he donated the palace of the Lateran, to the Church for its first basilica. The Lateran is the cathedral of the Bishop of Rome, the pope, and as such, it ranks as the "mother and head of all Churches in Rome and in the World". MAGNIFICAT

Saint Leo the Great was Pope from 440 until his death in 461. He is the first pope to leave sermons for us to read. His 97 sermons communicate in exquisite Latin the mysteries of the faith. In sermon 74, he preaches, "What was to be seen of our Redeemer has passed over into the sacraments." MAGNIFICAT

Saint Martin of Tours was born in present-day Hungary; while serving in the Roman army he met a poor, half-clothed man outside the city gates, Martin drew his sword and divided his own cloak in two, giving half to the naked man. That night, he saw Jesus in a vision: "Martin, who is still but a catechumen, gave me this robe," our Lord told the angels. In 372, he was elected Bishop of Tours; he died in 397.

Saint Josaphat born in Poland, raised Ukrainian Orthodox, becoming a Basilian monk of the Ruthenian Rite; Archbishop of Polotsk (present-day Ukraine); his fidelity to the Roman See and his desire for union between the Ukrainian Church and Rome led to his murder by an angry Orthodox mob in 1623. MAGNIFICAT

TODAY'S READINGS

- First Reading — The King of the world will raise us up to live again forever (2 Maccabees 7:1-2, 9-14).

Second Reading — May the Lord encourage and strengthen your hearts (2 Thessalonians 2:16 — 3:5).
Gospel — Those who are deemed worthy of the coming age can no longer die (Luke 20:27-38 [27, 34-38]).

Brothers and Sisters,

On this thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time our scripture portrays people whose faith in eternal life with the Lord gives them confidence during times of trial. In our 1st reading, 7 brothers and their mother are arrested, tortured and die for their faith. St. Paul reminds his readers in our 2nd reading that God is faithful and will guard them and keep them safe even if difficulties come. In our gospel Jesus is in Jerusalem, where soon he will be arrested and sentenced to death.

The 1st reading from the book of 2nd Maccabees introduces us to the doctrine of the resurrection of the dead. One of the brothers at the point of death says to the brothers' persecutors, "You accursed fiend, you are depriving us of this present life, but the King of the world will raise us up to live again forever." It is the faith of the brothers and their mother in the resurrection that gives them and us hope. Two themes emerge in St. Paul's letter to the Thessalonians chosen for today's liturgy: eschatological hope (hope for the end time) and intercessory prayer. Today's letter reminds the people that it is Jesus himself who encourages us in our journey through life. Jesus alone is the source of our eternal hope. The disciples and we are encouraged to pray that the word of God go forward. We are to intercede for the world that all will cooperate with the will of God.

Today's liturgy reminds us of our foundational truths. We are resurrection people who will share eternal life. Our eternal resting place is not merely an extension of this earthly life, but is a new existence. We will be changed, not dead. We cannot assume to know what life after death will be like, it is a mystery. We can, however, be assured that our God is a God of the living, not the dead. God wishes that we share eternal life with him. In the gospel of the day, Jesus is once again in a confrontational dialogue, this time with the Sadducees. The Sadducees provide us with a model for a people without hope. Their cynical question of whose wife the woman in the story would be at the resurrection portrays their unbelief in the resurrection of the dead. Thus, they live only for today. Jesus in turn tells them their thinking is very limited. The marriages(s) in the story are something that belongs to this world (today's world) not to the next. The resurrected life goes beyond the dimensions of an earthly existence. Thus, expectations and practices in this world do not hold in the next.

As Christians we may wonder about what life after death will be like. We may try to imagine what heaven will be. Even though our faith does not provide us with a picture of heaven, it fills us with hope for an everlasting life of intimacy with God, the source of all love.

Voting is a privilege. As citizens of the United States of America, we have seen what can happen when the rights of citizens are not respected. Sham elections in southern Ukraine where military solicit your vote at the end of a rifle barrel. Or Communist countries where leaders are elected and declare themselves presidents for life. PRAYER OF THE WEEK

Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Almighty and merciful God,
graciously keep from us all adversity,
so that, unhindered in mind and body alike,
we may pursue in freedom of heart
the things that are yours.
Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,
who lives and reigns with you
in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

REFLECTION QUESTION:

How does adversity hinder me from pursuing the things of God?

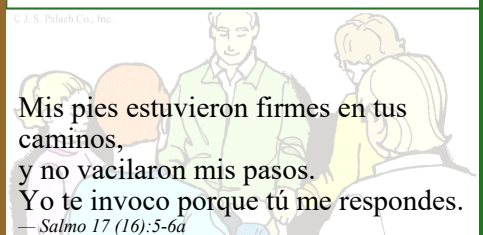

10 de noviembre - San León Magno, Papa y doctor de la Iglesia

11 de noviembre - San Martín de Tours, obispo

12 de noviembre - San Josafat, obispo y mártir

Basílica de San Juan de Letrán, en el año 313 el emperador romano Constantino declaró el Edicto de Milán, concediendo la libertad religiosa a los cristianos, y donó el palacio de Letrán, a la Iglesia para su primera basílica. La de Letrán es la catedral del Obispo de Roma, el Papa, y como tal, es la "madre y cabeza de todas las Iglesias de Roma y del mundo". **MAGNIFICAT**

San León Magno fue Papa desde el año 440 hasta su muerte en el 461. Es el primer papa que dejó sermones para que los leyéramos. Sus 97 sermones comunican en un latín exquisito los misterios de la fe. En el sermón 74, predica: "Lo que había que ver de nuestro Redentor ha pasado a los sacramentos". **MAGNIFICAT**

San Martín de Tours nació en la actual Hungría; mientras servía en el ejército romano se encontró con un pobre hombre medio vestido a las puertas de la ciudad, Martín sacó su espada y dividió su propia capa en dos, dando la mitad al hombre desnudo. Esa noche, vio a Jesús en una visión: "Martín, que aún no es más que un catecúmeno, me ha dado este manto", dijo el Señor a los ángeles. En 372, fue elegido obispo de Tours; murió en 397.

San Josafat, nacido en Polonia, criado como ortodoxo ucraniano, se convirtió en monje basilico de rito ruteno; arzobispo de Polotsk (actual Ucrania); su fidelidad a la sede romana y su deseo de unión entre la Iglesia ucraniana y Roma le llevaron a ser asesinado por una turba ortodoxa enfurecida en 1623. **MAGNIFICAT**
