HONORING THE HEBREW PROPHECIES ABOUT MESSIAH:

A Good Friday litany based on 'The Song of The Suffering Servant' (Isaiah 52:13-53:12)

Leader: Holy GOD, we come tonight to both honor YOUR wise and faithful servant and to wrestle with our own darkness.

<u>PEOPLE:</u> We, each and every one of us, have both received YOUR merciful gifts and have turned our backs on YOU when the going has gotten rough.

Leader: Tonight, strengthen us -that we might not turn our eyes away from all Jesus endured, all that we had a hand in inflicting upon him.

<u>PEOPLE:</u> He was one of us –nurtured and sustained by YOU, sharing a common lot with the human family. Yet, we ignored and ridiculed him.

<u>Leader:</u> Despised, rejected -a man of suffering, all too familiar with pain. <u>PEOPLE:</u> And yet, he took up our pain. He bears our suffering.

Leader: Still, we fail to esteem him. We add insult to the injuries he sustained on our behalf.

<u>PEOPLE:</u> Pierced for our transgressions, crushed for our sins; the punishment that brings us peace was leveled against him.

Leader: By his wounds we are healed! But, we all, like sheep, have gone astray -each of us has turned to our own way.

<u>PEOPLE:</u> Oh LORD, YOU laid on him the failures of us all. He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth.

Leader: Like a lamb led to the slaughter, or as a sheep before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.

<u>PEOPLE:</u> Through a corruption of justice and unfair oppression, he was taken away. <u>Leader:</u> We know that, like those of his own generation, we have failed to protest such inequity, we have allowed that sweet and sacred life to be punished again and again.

<u>PEOPLE:</u> Cut-off from the land of the living, YOUR servant was assigned a criminal's execution and grave. He had done no violence, nor was any deceit in his mouth.

Leader: Yet, somehow, YOU O LORD, allowed his suffering to serve as an offering for our sin.

<u>PEOPLE:</u> And that is why YOU have promised him the reward of an eternal family which stretches and will continue to stretch across the nations and the generations.

Leader: After all his pain, after all the indignities, he will see the light of life and be satisfied.

<u>PEOPLE:</u> By this knowledge, YOUR righteous servant will justify us and cleanse us from wrongdoing.

Leader: May we give him the respect he deserves. May we follow him throughout his trials this night. May we rightly honor him as he endures the torment and humiliation which we are deserving of.

<u>ALL:</u> And though this king of bloodied-crown will face discrimination and death, we know that YOU gave him The Name above every name.

May we bless that name this night and give thanks through honest confrontation with the part we play. For he bore our sins and through him, we have peace. AMEN!
