From The Community Spiritual Director

Well, even though things seem to be opening up a little bit we are all still experiencing some social distancing and isolation. How long this is going to continue is anybody's guess. I'm sure many of you have seen changes in your daily routine. One of the things I have done to pass the time is a little more social media. Most of the posts I see I merely scroll through but occasionally I see something that grabs my attention. One post I saw recently was a remake of an old axiom. The post said, "The pessimist sees the glass as half empty, the optimist sees the glass as half full, and the Christian sees the glass as overflowing" (Psalm 23:5). I like that.

We, as Christians are called to be different than those living in the world and we are also supposed to see things differently. We are living in a difficult time. We can easily see problems all around us. However, we can also choose to see that God is giving us time apart from the world to focus on our relationship with him and to get deeper into his Word. It's going to be different for each one of us, but my point is that we can always see the difficulties or the positives. It depends on where our focus is. I know that several of you have gone through some very serious problems that most of us will never have to experience. My heart goes out to you. I know it can be very difficult to see anything good in times when there just seems to be very little hope. Some of you may be going through very dark days right now. Most of us will have days in the future when trouble seems to overwhelm us. Jesus told his followers, "In this world you will have trouble" (John 16:33). He seems to be reminding me of that Scripture very often here lately. However, we don't want to stop there, because that's only half of that verse. The second half reminds us to "take heart, for I have overcome the world." So, whatever we're going through, whatever comes our way in the days to come we know that our cup overflows.

Some time ago I had a conversation with someone who was several years older than me. I was talking about all my aches and pains as I am prone to do. At the end of my list of complaints I told him I attributed a lot of it to my age. He said, "Just wait until you get to be my age. You don't have much to look forward to." Now I have a wonderful gift of being able to come up with exactly the right words to say to reply to statements that may throw some people for a loop. Unfortunately, I normally come up with these words about two days later. After this particular conversation I came up with these words (again, it was two days too late): "I have a lot to look forward to. My best days are ahead of me. My future is so bright I have to wear shades." I want you to know that your best days are ahead of you. These days we are living in, these difficult days, may last for quite a while. But our focus is on the fact that God has called us to be his children, he has given us his Word to direct us, he has given his Son to pay for our sin, and he has promised us a bright day, a bright future, an overflowing cup. Just as Jesus said he had overcome the world, he has also made us more than conquerors, no weapon formed against us will prosper. We may not always see it, but the more we keep our focus on the right things, the more we will see how blessed we are. Stay safe. Hope we can get together again real soon.
