The Stony Ground

MATTHEW 13:20-21

But he that received the seed into stony places, the same is he that heareth the word, and anon with joy receiveth it; Yet hath he not root in himself, but dureth for a while: for when tribulation or persecution ariseth because of the word, by and by he is offended.


1. The stony ground represents a heart that is mostly <u>hardened</u> towards God's Word. Ezekiel 11:19, 36:26; Amos 6:12; Zechariah 7:12

2. The sun represents the normal <u>challenges</u> that are a part of living for

Christ. Mark 4:16-17, Luke 8:13

-The stony ground believer "burns out" somewhere between <u>salvation</u> and <u>discipleship</u>.

3. In order to <u>endure</u> the difficulties of discipleship, you must allow God's Word to take deep root in your heart.



4. We must <u>anticipate</u> that there will always be people with just enough depth to get saved, but not enough to grow strong in their <u>faith</u>.

5. God's Word can <u>break</u> the stony heart. Jeremiah 32:29

We should not be <u>content</u> with stony hearts, but rather <u>pray</u> and <u>work</u> for stony hearts to be broken up so that God's Word can take deep root.
