'Small things making a big difference': High school students donate toys for pediatric playroom

Victoria Virgen clearly remembers when her younger sister Carlene was undergoing a tumor removal surgery. "It was a very scary time for all of us," recalled Victoria, now a senior at Mt. SAC Early College Academy. She has a vivid memory of her father taking her to buy two-year-old Carlene a plush animal during her hospital stay. "When we handed it to her, she was so happy and still has it today," shared Victoria.

Victoria wanted to ensure this same feeling of joy for pediatric patients at Emanate Health Queen of the Valley Hospital (QVH). As president of the Antlers Youth Division of the West Covina Elks Lodge (1996), Victoria worked with her fellow members to coordinate a donation of infant and toddler toys for the QVH Pediatric Playroom.

Last month, Victoria and Carlene, who is also an Antler member, dropped off the toys with other group members. The girls' parents, Carlos and Angelica, are Elks members and serve on the committee that guides the young people in their service efforts. "The students select and run the projects," noted Angelica, who is grateful for the past care she has received at QVH. "It's their work and they get to see the outcomes."

Like Victoria, Angelica remembers what an impact age-appropriate toys had during Carlene's hospital stay. "It is painful as a parent to see your child sick," recalled Angelica. "But when they are playing with toys, they aren't worrying about their condition or pain... something like this can brighten their day."

Emanate Health Child Life Specialist Gina Day Vaughan has seen the impact of toy donations firsthand, noting that the items are not just for amusement. "Children learn through play," Gina said. "Having toys specifically for infants and toddlers meets an important need because it fosters growth and development for these young patients during their hospitalizations, while also providing a sense of autonomy and mastery of a stressful place." In addition to the patients' delight, Gina also observes the gratitude of their parents. "They are so thankful. For example, musical toys can help calm and soothe infants. If a toddler needs to be in an isolation room [due to their condition], allowing to play makes them less scared and can be a distraction from a procedure or taking vital signs."

Victoria plans to pursue a career in the medical field because she wants to continue helping others. "The Antlers and I were happy to give back to the community. When we had the opportunity to donate these toys, I was over the moon because I know that small things can make a big difference!"
