A note from the Pastor...

Now the word of the Lord came to me saying, "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you; I appointed you a prophet to the nations." Then I said, "Ah, Lord God! Truly I do not know how to speak, for I am only a boy." But the Lord said to me, "Do not say, 'I am only a boy'; for you shall go to all to whom I send you, and you shall speak whatever I command you. Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you to deliver you, says the Lord." Jeremiah 1:4-8

This month our journey in worship with the scriptures will take us before the prophets of Israel, those people called and empowered by God to speak for him to Israel's kings and its people. One that we will hear is Jeremiah, whose ministry took place during one of the greatest crises in Israel's history—the destruction of Jerusalem and its Temple which began the time of Exile for Israel's leaders and many of its people. It is hard to underestimate the sorrow and fear this created—the world of faith as the people knew seemed to be coming undone. In this time Jeremiah was called to convey in words and deeds the ongoing faithfulness of God.

To each and every challenge that we face in this life, the call of Jeremiah emphasizes that God is intimately involved with God's people. From before he was born, God already had Jeremiah in mind for this special vocation to be God's prophet, before God formed him in his mother's womb, God already intimately knew him (verse 5). And in verse 8, God ensures the prophet of God's enduring presence -- a promise that is beautifully illustrated by the reference to God touching Jeremiah's mouth (verse 9), so giving him the words to speak.

Despite this affirmation of God's presence, Jeremiah still voices his feelings of being incapable of fulfilling his mission. Echoing the psalms of lament in verse 6, "Ah Lord God!", Jeremiah states that he is very young, only a boy. With this hesitation, it is clear that as elsewhere in the biblical witness, God uses ordinary, fallible human beings to serve as God's witnesses. Truly in the very difficult circumstances captured in the book Jeremiah, which would also throughout Jeremiah's life cause him much pain and the suffering, the only way the prophet would be able to fulfill his calling is due to God working through him.

The God who created the cosmos and who created you knows you every bit as intimately as Jeremiah. Before you were born God consecrated you for a special purpose. It might be teacher, mechanic, sales associate, business owner, farmer, nursing assistant, parent, spouse, or any of a zillion other things. Regardless, you are called to live out that calling faithfully. And like Jeremiah and so many Biblical figures, we may not always feel up to the task. The excuses are many, but God's response is always the same, "I am with you."

This month God will be with us as we baptize a new child on All Saints Sunday. God will be with us as we remember those saints in our lives who have been called from this life into the Church triumphant. God will be with us as we give thanks for all of those baptized here in the last year. And God will be with us as we gather in Annual Meeting to plan our life together in the year ahead. As children of God we can never say, "I am only. . ." for in everything we do it is God who gives us the strength and ability and even the money to do them. And we do them to the glory of God." Thanks be to God!

PASTOR'S REPORT: One day vacation (family illness). Cub Scout leaders are talking with Pastor about troop concerns.


President Kyle W. adjourned the meeting.

Most importantly, we need your prayers for our ministry. This will be new for all of us and we're sure to stumble a few times along the way– please pray for the success of our program and that we're able to grow as a family as we reach out to comfort those in need.

A Growing Family

Lindsey and Andrea were no strangers to foster parenting. Their older brother fostered children for 10 years, and they were inspired by his drive and passion for supporting vulnerable children. Until recently, they hadn't seen themselves as foster parents. But something in their hearts told them they were needed. "It's been on our hearts for a lot of years, and we have the room and love," Andrea says. "It's something we knew we could do and it's needed."

The two sisters decided to become licensed foster parents earlier this year through LSI Foster Care and Adoption. Now, they are caring for children in foster care at the same time. Lindsey and Andrea regularly meet up to support one another and ensure the children can connect and feel less alone during the most vulnerable time in their young lives. "It's been so important to have a connection to another foster family," Lindsey says. "The kids can see they're not different. There are other children in their same situation."

Meanwhile, they are busy building a strong bond with the children's birth families. Lindsey says foster parenting is a way for them to give a child stability while also nurturing their whole family. Lindsey and Andrea have also found support from other local foster families. They are there for each other, offering a shoulder to lean on when anyone needs an extra boost on the difficult days. "There is a need for foster families in lowa, and there is so much good that comes out of fostering," Andrea says.


