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

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I recently learned about Christian author and speaker Elisabeth Elliot. Born in Brussels, Belgium in 1926 to missionary parents, she spent most of her childhood stateside in the Germantown neighborhood of Philadelphia. At Wheaton College, she studied Classical Greek believing that it was the best tool to help her with the calling of ultimately translating the New Testament of the Bible into an unknown language. It was at Wheaton where she met Jim Elliot. The two traveled to Ecuador as missionaries, and later married in 1953 in the city of Quito. Ecuador.

A few years later. Jim was speared to death along with four of his missionary friends while attempting to contact the Huaorani tribe. Their daughter, Valerie was only 10 months old when her father was killed, and in spite of it all, Elisabeth later spent two years as a missionary to the tribe members who killed her husband. Returning to the United States after many years in South America, she became widely known as the author of over twenty books and as a speaker. Elliot toured the country, sharing her knowledge and experience, well into her seventies.

After retiring from her traveling missionary work, Elisabeth could be heard on the daily radio program, Gateway to Joy. Elisabeth almost always opened the program with the phrase, "'You are loved with an everlasting love,' - that's what the Bible says - 'and underneath are the everlasting arms.' This is your friend, Elisabeth Elliot...

In reading her quote, "Frustration is not the will of God. There is time to do anything and everything that God wants us to do." I was startled at the truth I found in it. I often feel as if there are not enough hours in the day to do all the things I need to do, much less want to

I find myself looking at the clock wondering where the time has gone, wondering how much more I can squeeze in, worrying that what has been left undone might just undo me.

Reading Elisabeth's quote has helped me reframe how I see time and how I use my time. In looking at a day's worth of work, I realized just about every minute of my day was indeed "kingdom" work. Of course, the email responses, the writings, the phone calls, the meetings - that all counts for bringing God's kingdom here. But too - the moments of rest, of laughter with the staff, of nourishing my body with food and my soul by reading a good book - these build up God's kingdom.

"We can't afford to waste a minute, must not squander these precious daylight hours in frivolity and indulgence, in sleeping around and dissipation, in bickering anout: - Nomano 13, 13-14 1913

This passage from Romans 13 often gets a bad rapport for reprimanding the children of God for being lazy, overindulgent, or even procrastinators. But I don't think Paul intends for us to go, go, go all the time. Instead, I see it as an invitation for us to balance our need for sabbath and re-creation with the work of living into the everlasting love and the everlasting arms of God. I love how "The Message" translates the last verse, that we are to be "dressed in Christ." In being dressed in Christ we live into Elisabeth's notion that there is time to do anything and everything God wants us to do.

How are you seeing God at work in your time? Where do you feel God calling you to use your time? May all you do in your day be done with that reminder of the loving Creator who loves you with an everlasting love and may you remember to be "dressed in Christ" in it all.

Prayer: Loving God, slow us down in our busy-ness. Help us to be clothed in Christ so that all we do might be your good and faithful work and bring your kingdom here. Remind us that there is time to do anything and everything you want us to do. Amen.
