# Get to Know the Shelter Cove Fire Department's Duty Officer Program

Ever wonder what the little red fire truck is doing driving around? Shelter Cove Fire has a solid volunteer-based department that supplements our 24/7 Duty Officer Program. Shelter Cove Fire has six part-time paid call

duty officers who include four EMT1s, one full time Fire Chief, and one Paramedic. The Shelter Cove Duty Officers are trained to the California Fire Marshal Firefighter 1 level or higher and many have a high number of company officer and rescue classes. Shelter Cove has one of these Duty Officers on call 24/7, 7 days a week to ensure when someone dials 911 in Shelter Cove there will always be someone responding in a <u>Fire Engine</u> just as fast as a





big city department. The Duty officer is in or around the station starting at 9am and takes the new type 6 quick attack (5147) home at night ensuring the fastest possible response during the nighttime hours as well. The Duty Officer's "Quick Attack" engine is a state of the art rescue vehicle set up to respond to any type of emergency including medical aids, fires, ocean rescue, rope rescue, auto extrication, all types of public assists and even vehicle lock outs. If anyone has any questions or would like to check out any of SCFD's equipment please feel free to come down to the station anytime the doors are open.

## From the Humboldt County Joint Information Center:

All Humboldt County residents who want to receive the COVID-19 vaccine can now submit their contact information through an online interest form to be notified when doses are available for their tier. Currently in Humboldt County, priority is given to frontline health care workers and people age 75. Vaccination appointments, while still limited, will be expanded to some in the coming days and weeks.

# From Southern Humboldt Community Healthcare District:

SoHum Health is following the guidance provided by the county related to the use of the COVID-19 vaccine. Each vial carries a minimum of five doses, often six doses, and on occasion seven. To comply with the current tier-intended target, we pre-schedule all appointments for vaccination. On occasion, particularly with the larger vaccine clinics there may be more doses available at the end of the session. On such occasions, we may provide the vaccine to people outside of the currently approved tier rather than waste the additional vaccine. If you name is not on the list, we can't call you!
