Timberwolf Construction LLC has been working over the past several months to get the building completed before a highly anticipated grand opening this Fall. An official opening date has not been scheduled and will ultimately depend on construction completion.

HVAC has been installed and crews have completed framing, drywall, and are currently working on completing bathroom areas and installing cabinetry. Crews will soon be working to seal the floors so fitness equipment can be installed in the next few days. Work will continue through the summer and crews are expecting to be finished in August 2021.

The facility will be open to people with and without disabilities in the community. Inside, members will find a variety of adaptive and standard fitness equipment in an effort to create a truly inclusive environment for everyone.

About The Scholarship: Each year Access II awards the Ed "Eddie" Grimes Scholarship to a student with a disability that will be continuing their education after high school. At the age of 38, Eddie Grimes enrolled in college and graduated from North Central Missouri College in 1992.

Eddie understood the difficulties of everyday life as a person with a disability. Diagnosed with osteoporosis, osteoarthritis, and emphysema, he got around using a wheelchair and oxygen. Ed became a teacher for an Adult Education Center where he helped others obtain their GED's, gain computer skills & knowledge, to live more independently.
