Presbyterian Women Giddings-Lovejoy Spring Gathering Saturday May 6, 2023 Taiwanese Presbyterian Church of Greater St. Louis

Lisa Palmer and Judy Schmelzle attended the Spring Gathering of Presbyterian Women of Giddings-Lovejoy Saturday May 6, 2023. The Gathering was at the Taiwenese Presbyterian Church of Greater St. Louis. The theme for the day was "Making a Bigger Table."

There were two speakers for the day. Dr. Damayanthi Niles Eden Seminary Professor and Rev. Marybeth McBryan, Catholic Priest of St. Louis.

Dr. Niles shared thoughts from her publication: Doing Theology with Humility, Generosity, and Wonder. She suggested we not focus on making a bigger table, but on throwing out the table completely, allowing all denominations to gather with no barriers. Accepting each other's diversity allows strength and growth in our faith and belief in the one true God.

Dr. Niles pointed out that by only knowing and staying within our preferred denominations, we create a small God. While in reality, He is bigger than anything we can begin to explain or, sometimes, even accept.

Rev. Mc Bryan talked of her journey in her faith from initially entering a convent at 17 to become a Roman Catholic Nun. She became dissatisfied with the hierarchy of the Roman Catholic Church and left before taking final vows. Rev. McBryan went through a long journey in her faith and various occupations including marriage with two children to finally discerning her call to become a Catholic Priest.

There was a business meeting which included the election and installation of leader for the Coordinating Team of Presbyterian Women of Giddings-Lovejoy.

The day ended with Worship and the Lord's Supper celebrated by Rev. Liz Kanerva Associate Presbytery Leader of Giddings-Lovejoy. The Scripture for the service was read by Sister Su Mei in Mandarin.

The women attending were served a traditional Chinese meal by the women from the Taiwenese Presbyterian Church.

10 Year Celebration!



Soapstone Form Cross

This special cross was presented to Pastor Steve by our congregation in recognition of his 10 years of service to our church. It is available to be viewed in Pastor Steve's study. The following gives the details of this cross:

The pink soapstone form for this cross was made in Germany c. 1550! It was likely originally used to emboss gold or silver foil to then be placed over a wooden or plaster base. The cross bears all the iconography of the Crucifixion without the body of Christ, so we know the piece was post-Reformation. At the top is the INRI, followed by the rooster — "You will betray me 3 times before the cock crows." Across the arms are the sun and moon for the three days and nights, Christ's pierced hand, the bag of silver pieces and the can of anointing oil. Next are the cherubs — one with a hammer to drive in the nails and another with tongs to pull the nails out. There is a ladder for Jesus to climb the cross and the spear that pierced his side. Below those are the dice the Romans cast for his garments. Then we have the face of Christ, his burial shroud or possibly the Veil of Veronica. Finally, there are the skull and crossbones referencing Golgotha and supremacy over death.
