Pondering Pastor--Kindness, A Fruit of The Spirit

Or do you despise the riches of his kindness and forbearance and patience? Do you not realize that God's kindness is meant to lead you to repentance? ~~Romans 2:4

Last month, in this Epistle, we shared with you about The Kindness Project. We are inviting you this year to do acts of kindness throughout the season of Lent, and share what you are doing. Last month, we gave you a calendar of suggested kindness acts, and in this month's Epistle you will find more suggested Acts of Kindness which should take you through to the end of Lent.

We would like to know what acts of kindness you are finding valuable! Each week we have colored paper on the communion table for you to write down your act of kindness and add to the jar we have also placed on the communion table. We want to collect all the kindness we can so we can share it! We may even pull random acts of kindness from the jar to share during our worship for thought for all ages.

As we focus on Kindness throughout Lent, we know the suffering of Holy Week is coming. On Palm Sunday, March 24th, we will bless our palms and contemplate the Passion of Christ. On Maundy Thursday, March 28th, we will have a Soup Supper at 6pm followed by a brief Service of the Word and Lord's Supper in Fellowship Hall. Holy Communion Episcopal will host a Seder dinner on March 28th; all are welcome-talk to Pastor Kelli to RSVP. On Good Friday, March 29th, we will have worship at Holy Communion Episcopal Church at 7pm; Rev. Dr. Croft and Pastor Kelli are planning to present Stations of the Cross as written by a Palestinian Christian.

We will celebrate Easter Sunday on Sunday March 31st at our 10:30 am service. An Easter Egg Hunt for children will follow during fellowship.




EQUAL EXCHANGE


At this time we are discussing running this program only during the cold months due to a lack of volunteers. Please reach out to Pastor Kelli if you can volunteer to help this ministry!
