LITURGY CORNER

**June 26 - THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**  
**June 27 - St. Cyril of Alexandria, Bishop, Doctor of the Church**  
**June 28 - Saint Irenaeus, Bishop, Martyr**  
**June 29 - SAINTS PETER AND PAUL, APOSTLES**  
**July 1 - Saint Junipero Serra, Priest**

**Saint Cyril of Alexandria** defended Mary as "God-bearer" (Theotokos) at the council of Ephesus (year 431); he died in 444; he was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Leo XIII in 1882.

**Saint Irenaeus** of Lyons, heard the preaching of Polycarp, one of the disciples of John the Evangelist; in his work, *Adversus Haereses*, he convincingly showed that the true Faith could be traced in a direct line to the original witnesses of the Resurrection, the twelve Apostles; he died in 202.

**Saint Peter** was called by Christ to lead and care for Christ's entire flock: "Feed my sheep!" (John 21:17); spokesman for the Twelve Apostles who became "Prince of the Apostles;" he was martyred around the year 64.

**Saint Paul** although not one of the Twelve, he is also called an Apostle - a former Pharisee who became the "Apostle of the Gentiles;" he was martyred around the year 67.



**Saint Junipero Serra, O.F.M.**, nicknamed "Apostle of California," he established nine of the 21 California Missions, thus recognized as a builder of the state of California. He died in 1784, at the age of 70, and is buried in California at Carmel Mission, Carmel-by-the-Sea; he was canonized by Pope Francis in Washington, D.C. on September 23, 2015.

TODAY'S READINGS

**First Reading** — The LORD tells Elijah to anoint Elisha as prophet to succeed him (1 Kings 19:16b, 19-21).

**Psalm** — You are my inheritance, O Lord (Psalm 16).

**Second Reading** — Use your freedom in Christ to serve one another through love (Galatians 5:1, 13-18).

**Gospel** — While journeying to Jerusalem, Jesus speaks of the costs of discipleship (Luke 9:51-62).

**Brothers and Sisters,**

On this 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time, we return to the color green as the principal liturgical color for our church environment for the next several months. The phrase “Ordinary Time” sounds a bit unexciting and can be misleading. In the church’s liturgical year, the term “ordinary” doesn’t mean “stagnant” or “routine” or “uneventful” as the term may imply. It actually refers to the Latin term “*ordinal*” which translated means “counted.” This simply means that this season between Easter and Christmas is “counted time”- time that is marked as we leave one season and approach another. If we were to be true to our Christian selves, we would understand that there is no such thing as “ordinary” time. All of time is special in that all of time has been marked by the life, death and resurrection of Christ. It all belongs to Christ.



All three readings today are concerned with the call of discipleship. Elijah calls Elisha in the name of Yahweh; Paul invites all to embrace their freedom from the law and sin, a freedom won by Christ’s death and resurrection. Disciples are taught about the rigors of discipleship. The demand is for nothing less than the entire gift of self.

In today’s first reading, Elijah, in the name of Yahweh called Elisha to prophetic service. Elijah went to Elisha and “threw his cloak over him.” The throwing of the cloak, the normal attire of a prophet, symbolized either ownership and responsibility or investiture and initiation of a successor. The Hebrew word translated here as “cloak” is often translated as “mantle.” Therefore, Elisha literally assumed the “mantle” of prophet. At that time there were many layers of meaning inherent in the gesture and those meanings can still be observed today in liturgical practice of the wearing of the stole by the deacon, and the wearing of the chasuble by the priest, and the wearing of the habit by religious.

The guiding principle in Paul’s letter to the Galatians is that freedom from the law is freedom from material observance. People have a choice. They can either be free, not to a life of selfishness and sin, but to one of generous service to others. Scripture tells us that the whole law is fulfilled in one statement, “You shall love your neighbor as yourself.”

We all need a place to be ourselves, where appearances don’t matter and where we can indulge in at least a few minutes of peace and quiet, briefly forgetting responsibilities and the “to-do” list.

There’s a difference between a “house” and a “home.” In today’s gospel Jesus declares he “has nowhere to rest his head” (a home). Were there moments when he wanted to escape to a place to call his own? Might he have liked occasionally to shut the front door and make the world go away for just a couple of hours? Apart from his times of solitary prayer, Jesus made himself available to others, known and unknown. Jesus wanted people to see and know him. Today’s gospel is about putting others before self.

Most of us have at some time, walked past a huddled sleeping bag spread across a park bench. We should always remember that few people are homeless by choice. For many, homelessness is because of circumstances that force them into a desperate search for the basics of life for themselves and their families. Jesus tells us to make our home in him just as he does in our hearts. That requires self-sacrifice for others.





**LLAMADA POR DIOS**

Este domingo volvemos al Tiempo Ordinario, y con este nuevo tiempo nos centramos en lo que significa ser una persona llamada por Dios para algún propósito definido. Eliseo reconoció la llamada de Dios en el saludo de Elías y se preparó inmediatamente para seguirle. Las personas que se acercaron a Jesús parecían dispuestas a seguir, pero cada una tenía razones para quedarse atrás. Como personas a las que se les da la libertad de seguir o quedarse atrás, debemos preguntarnos qué estamos dispuestos a hacer por el bien de Cristo y la llamada del Evangelio. ¿Qué estás llamado a hacer en este momento de tu vida? ¿Estás preparado para dejar atrás las cosas que te impiden vivir como cristiano?

**SEGUIR**

¿Qué significa seguir a Jesús? Los evangelios nos muestran que Jesús llamó a cada persona individualmente, reconociendo las cosas que se interponían en el camino de cada uno. Miró en el corazón de la persona y vio los verdaderos deseos de la persona que estaba ante él. Cada uno de nosotros experimenta la llamada de Cristo de forma única, como personas que somos. Para algunos, el seguimiento requiere que hagamos un balance de nuestras vidas y dejemos de lado los obstáculos que nos alejan del camino del verdadero discipulado. Para otros, la llamada puede llevarnos a profundizar en el modo en que la fe dirige nuestras vidas, con más tiempo intencionado de oración, participación regular en la Misa, atención renovada a la familia, participación en nuestra parroquia o nuevos actos de servicio.

**ESTAR LISTO**

Es fácil decir que queremos seguir a Jesús, pero la mayoría de nosotros sentimos deseos contrapuestos que se interponen en el camino del discipulado. Puede que nos distraiga el constante torbellino de actividad que prevalece en la cultura que nos rodea; puede que nos atraiga la riqueza mundana y el estatus que a menudo la acompaña; puede que simplemente nos sintamos cómodos con la forma en que están las cosas y nos resulte difícil arriesgarnos a cambiar algo. En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús deja claro que debemos dejar de posponer los cambios que nos acercarán a él y al estilo de vida de Dios. Debemos confiar en el Señor, sabiendo que lo que más deseas es que estemos cerca de él. Si hoy te encuentras con Jesús y le dices que estás dispuesto a seguirle, ¿qué vería él en tu corazón, qué obstáculos o vacilaciones percibiría? Acércate a Jesús en la oración de este día. Escúchale decir: "Sígueme". Pon en oración tu vida en manos del Señor y prepárate para seguirle.

- 1 de julio - San Junípero Serra, presbítero**

**San Cirilo de Alejandría** defendió a María como “portadora de Dios” (Theotokos) en el concilio de Éfeso (año 431); murió en el 444; fue declarado Doctor de la Iglesia por el Papa León XIII en 1882.

**San Ireneo de Lyon**, escuchó la predicación de Policarpo, uno de los discípulos de Juan el Evangelista; en su obra, *Adversus Haereses*, demostró de forma convincente que la verdadera Fe podía rastrearse en línea directa hasta los testigos originales de la Resurrección, los doce Apóstoles; murió en el año 202.

**San Pedro** fue llamado por Cristo para dirigir y cuidar todo el rebaño de Cristo: “¡Apacienta mis ovejas!” (Juan 21:17); portavoz de los Doce Apóstoles que se convirtió en “Príncipe de los Apóstoles”; fue martirizado hacia el año 64.

**San Pablo**, aunque no es uno de los Doce, también es llamado Apóstol - un antiguo fariseo que se convirtió en el “Apóstol de los Gentiles”; fue martirizado alrededor del año 67.



**San Junípero Serra, O.F.M.**, apodado “Apóstol de California”, estableció nueve de las 21 Misiones de California, por lo que se le reconoce como constructor del estado de California. Murió en 1784, a la edad de 70 años, y está enterrado en California en la Misión Carmel, Carmel-by-the-Sea; fue canonizado por el Papa Francisco en Washington, D.C. el 23 de septiembre de 2015.
