Travel along road straight toward tennis courts and the gym. Turn left behind gym keeping school buildings on your left hand side, turn right at Penny Lane sign – barn will be ahead on your right.
- **From 29 South:** Take US 29 North to the first Chatham exit (Route 57). Turn left at the top of the exit ramp. Turn right at the back gate toward tennis courts and the gym. Turn left behind gym keeping school buildings on your left hand side, turn right at Penny Lane sign – barn will be ahead on your right.

SWVHJA DIVISION SPECIFICATIONS

Point accumulation will run from December 1st through the Annual Show/Medal Finals.

PRE- BEGINNER EQUITATION - Open to junior and amateur riders in their first year of showing over fences less than 2' in height. Riders are eligible for one horse show year and may not enter divisions with fence heights of 2' or above. This division will not count against rider's one year eligibility for the Beginner Equitation division. To be judged on rider's position and control. Division may be combined with the Beginner Equitation division at Management's discretion if entries warrant. Fence materials limited to: rails, small flower boxes, or brush. Ground line material may not make jump wider than it is high. Course to be a minimum of 6 jumps. Fence height 18". No oxers permitted.

BEGINNER EQUITATION – Open to junior and amateur riders in their first year of showing over fences 2' in height. No oxers permitted. Riders are eligible for one horse show year and may not enter divisions with fence heights exceeding 2'. This division will not count against rider's 2 year eligibility for the Intermediate Hunter division. To be judged on rider's position and control. Division may be split between juniors and adults at the discretion of show management. Division may be combined with the Pre-Beginner Equitation division at Management's discretion if entries warrant. If divisions are combined, fence materials and course MUST be limited to the same material as the Pre-Beginner division.

JUNIOR EQUITATION ON THE FLAT 15-17 - Open to riders who have reached their 15th birthday by December 1st of the calendar year, but not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the calendar year. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring and judged on position, control, and guidance. USEF tests 1-19 may be used, excluding those requiring work over fences. Three entries are necessary to fill this class. Riders need not be members of SWVHJA to compete. If there are insufficient entries, this class may be combined with the Junior Equitation on the Flat 14 & under and/or the Adult Equitation on the flat.

JUNIOR EQUITATION ON THE FLAT 14 & Under - Open to riders who have not reached their 15th birthday by December 1st of the calendar year. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring and judged on position, control, and guidance. USEF tests 1-19 may be used, excluding those requiring work over fences. Three entries are necessary to fill this class. Riders need not be members of SWVHJA to compete. If there are insufficient entries, this class may be combined with the Junior Equitation on the Flat 15-17.

SWVHJA HUNTER SEAT MEDAL - Open to riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the calendar year. To be shown over a course of fences not to exceed 3' that must include two changes of direction, a combination and at least three oxers. A minimum of six riders, if available, must be called back to work on the flat. Martingales may not be used in the flat phase. Each phase to count 50%. Same horse must be used for both phases. Four entries are required to fill the class with a minimum of three to complete the class. If there are fewer than four entries, this class can be combined with the Adult Medal. SWVHJA Hunter Seat Medal contestants may compete throughout the year. The top twenty (20) point earners (including ties), with a minimum of 10 points, will be invited to compete in the Hunter Seat Medal Finals.

SWVHJA ADULT MEDAL - Same specs as for the SWVHJA Hunter Seat Medal Class, except open to amateur riders 18 years of age and older. Ponies may be ridden by adults, but may not be shown in the Pony Hunter division at the same horse show. If there are fewer than

Show Rules

- The judge's decision is final
- Proof of negative coggins on all ponies and horses, current within one year, is required at registration. Coggins are also required for any horses or ponies that travel to the horse show but do not enter in classes.
- All entry forms must be completed and signed by the participant or by a parent, guardian, or trainer for riders under the age of 18.
- All riders while present on the property of Chatham Hall's campus must wear an ASTM/SEI approved helmet while mounted.
- Proper tack and attire required.
- Junior riders are those considered 18 or younger on December 1, 2018.
- Divisions may be combined, split or canceled at the discretion of show management.
- Stalls will be available on a first come first serve basis until stabling is no longer available. Stabling requests need to be communicated by Wednesday at noon.
- Any questions or disputes not covered in the Rules and Specifications or in any other section of this prize list shall be subject to the decision of the show management.
- No firearms are permitted on campus.
- The Horse Show management, volunteers, property owners, and agents acting on behalf of SWVHJA or Chatham Hall are not responsible for any accident or injury to spectators, riders, handlers, their property, animals, or possessions. Entering the show grounds constitutes acceptance of this policy.

CHATHAM HALL EQUITATION ON THE FLAT - Open to all riders - juniors, amateurs, and professionals. Riders may show horses or ponies. Judge has the option to call back 6 riders to test after the initial flat phase.

SWEET BRIAR COLLEGE MEDAL - Open to juniors and amateurs. To be shown over a course of no less than six jumps set at 2'9", with two changes of direction, in and out optional. The judge may test the top four riders, using Tests 1-10. Same horse must be used in both phases. Three competitors must complete the course for points to count. Riders may not have shown in a 3'6" or higher equitation class and may not jump higher than 2'9" at the same show. Finals will be held at the Sweet Briar College Winter Horse Show in December. To qualify for finals, a rider must accumulate 20 points or be in the top 15 point earners for the year. Riders may continue to compete throughout the year.

RANDOLPH COLLEGE MEDAL - Open to junior and adult amateur riders who have not qualified for the SWVHJA Hunter Seat Medal, SWVHJA Adult Medal or the Oak Ridge Medal during the existing or previous year; qualifiers for the Pony Medal are still eligible. Winners of any of the 3' finals are prohibited from competing. The previous year's Randolph medal winner is not eligible to compete in the finals the following year, but may still continue to show in the RC Medal for that year. The class will consist of two phases, each counting for 50% of the total score. First phase shall be shown over a course of no less than 8 fences at 2'6". The course must contain two changes of direction after the first fences and will not contain a combination. The second phase will be a flat phase, shown at the walk, trot and canter both directions of the ring. Judges may choose from USEF tests 1-10. The same horse must be used for both phases. Martingales are permitted in the flat phase. **Three entries are required to fill the class with a minimum of three to complete the class.** The top 15 point earners, including ties, shall be invited to compete in the finals held at the Randolph College Fall Festival Horse Show and Oak Ridge Medal Finals.

CHATHAM HALL MINI MEDAL - The Chatham Hall Mini-Medal is open to all junior or amateurs that have not competed over 2'6" within the show year. Riders can show horses or ponies over an equitation course of 8 jumps. A minimum of 4 riders to fill.

HOPEFUL HUNTER - Open to all horses and ponies. Judged on performance, manners and way of going. Fences 2'3"

PLEASURE HUNTER - Open to all horses and ponies. Judged on performance, manners and way of going. Fences to be 18" and 2'. No oxers.

four entries, this class can be combined with the Hunter Seat Medal. SWVHJA Adult Medal contestants may compete throughout the year. The top twenty (20) point earners (including ties), with a minimum of 10 points, will be invited to compete in the Adult Medal Finals.

INTERMEDIATE HUNTER - Open to anyone in their first or second year of showing, on horses or ponies, excluding the Beginner Equitation division. Fences 2'3". Riders who show at 2'6" or above in their first year forfeit a second Intermediate year. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. The rider may not jump higher than 2'6" at the same horse show.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER - Open to juniors mounted on horses. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences 3'. Management may combine this division with the Adult Amateur Hunter division if there are fewer than 3 entries.

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER - Open to adult amateur riders mounted on horses or ponies. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Ponies shown by an adult may not be shown in the Pony Hunter division at the same horse show. Fences 3'. Management may combine this division with the Children's Hunter division if there are fewer than 3 entries.

SPECIAL ADULT HUNTER - Open to Adult Amateur riders mounted on horses or ponies. Fences to be 2'6" or 2'9". Both heights must be offered and judged together. Related distances between two jumps should be no less than 60' (4 strides). Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Horse/rider combination cannot compete over fences higher than 2'9" at the same horse show. Ponies shown by an adult may not be shown in the pony hunter division at the same horse show. The Special Adult Hunter division and the Special Children's Hunter division may be combined if there are fewer than 3 in either section.

SPECIAL CHILDREN'S HUNTER - Same specs as the Special Adult Hunter, except open to junior riders.

ADULT HUNTER PLEASURE HORSE - Open to horses shown with hunter tack on the flat ridden by an Adult. Classes to be offered may include but are not limited to: Walk/Go As You Please, Walk/Trot, and Walk/Trot/Canter. No over fences classes will count toward this division. (Shows offering a Pleasure Hunter division with over fences classes may offer this division as a separate division.) It is acceptable for SWVHJA Horse Shows to combine the Adult Hunter Pleasure and the Junior Pleasure Hunter Divisions, however, it is the show secretary's responsibility to indicate on the results which is the Adult rider and which is the Junior rider. If entries warrant, the Hunter Pleasure Pony division may be combined with the Junior Hunter Pleasure Division and the Adult Hunter Pleasure Horse division. To be judged on manners, suitability, and way of going. For year end points to accrue, three entries must enter and compete in all three classes of the division.

JUNIOR HUNTER PLEASURE HORSE - Same specs as the Adult Hunter Pleasure Horse except open to Junior riders.

HUNTER PLEASURE PONY - Open to ponies shown with hunter tack on the flat ridden by a Junior. Classes to be offered but are not limited to: Walk/Go As You Please, Walk/Trot, and Walk/Trot/Canter. No over fences classes will count toward this division. (Shows offering a Pleasure Hunter division with over fences classes may offer this division as a separate division.) If entries warrant, the Hunter Pleasure Pony division may be combined with the Junior Hunter Pleasure Horse division and Adult Hunter Pleasure Horse division.
