Pondering Pastor

"For my house will be called a house of prayer for all people" Isaiah 56:7c

I was watching *Fiddler on the Roof* the other day when it occurred to me that the main character Tevye is a wonderful example of a praying person. Throughout the musical he is talking to God about all his troubles, at one point stopping to ask God "Who do you tell your troubles to?"

Prayer is one of the most fundamental spiritual practices available to us. It may be so essential to the Christian life that we don't often talk about what prayer is. A few years ago, when C. Parsons died, his daughter-in-law asked if I might like some of his books. Little did I know he had what I venture to say was the best theological library in Sweetwater County! I am still exploring what I found there. One of the treasures was a book called Prayer and the Common Life by Georgia Harkness. It is a small volume that points out the need for prayer in modern life. Harkness starts the first chapter by saying "[u]nless prayer is grounded upon a sound structure of belief, it becomes magic, or wishful thinking, or at best a form of therapeutic meditation" (25). It is as hard to define what prayer is but it is based on our personal relationship with God. Prayer is not worship or wishing. Prayer is seeking to align ourselves to God's will as we live in the world. Prayer is simply talking to God about everything! The rest of Harkness' book speaks to ways to pray, types of prayer, and even how prayer is helpful to our psychological lives. The book has got me thinking about how little we think and talk about prayer, something many of us do multiple times a day.

During this summer we spent time in worship singing, praying, and thinking about the psalms. The psalms have given us some ideas about how to pray and hopefully have broadened our ideas of how and what we can pray about. I thought one way to follow up the psalms would be to spend some time talking about how and why we pray. So look for this theme coming to worship in August!

Don't forget to enjoy our prayer labyrinth! It's a great place to ponder and talk to God! Pastor Kelli

St. Christopher's Highway Needs Volunteers!

FCC has partnered with our friends at Holy Communion Episcopal Church, Mount of Olives Lutheran Church and (now!) First Baptist Church to run St. Christopher's Highway. St. Christopher is a traveler's assistance program funded by the Episcopal Diocese of Wyoming. We are now in critical need of volunteers! Volunteers take the St. Christopher phone for a week at a time and provide travelers with gas cards, bus tickets, hotel rooms, or food according to need and volunteer discernment. Training is provided.

At this time we are discussing running this program only during the cold months due to a lack of volunteers. Please reach out to Pastor Kelli if you can volunteer to help this ministry!
