

So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." John 20:1-2

The fifty days from the Sunday of the Resurrection to Pentecost Sunday are celebrated in joy and exultation as one feast day, indeed as one 'great Sunday' -St. Athanasius

Divine Mercy Sunday, April 24th, Holy Hour 3:00pm to 4:00pm. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be prayed along with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

The readings at the Easter Vigil clearly tell us of God's plan of salvation.



At St. Catherine Church

A Special *Care for Creation* Mass with Blessing of Seeds, Plants and Gardeners will be held on April 23

In response to Pope Francis' call to celebrate our connectedness to all of God's Creation we will gather at 8:15 a.m. for mass, followed by a blessing of Plants, Seeds, Gardening Tools and Gardeners immediately afterwards on the patio side of the church.

All are invited (whether you have a green thumb or not!) to join in the celebration by bringing your plants, seeds, gardening tools and yourselves to the church patio for a blessing.

The blessing of crops, fields and gardens is an old tradition in the church. On Rogation Days, the three days before the solemnity of the Ascension, priests would venture out into the fields and bless the soil as they prayed the Litany of the Saints.

Prior to residential growth (and the building of the Ontario International Airport) the grapevines in the Ontario/Rancho Cucamonga area would yield their fruit and be piled high on palettes for the annual blessing by the local priest before the grapes were taken to the winepress and turned into wine.

While most of the vineyards are now gone, this tradition has continued with the blessing of gardens, fields and orchards and may be celebrated whenever it seems appropriate to ask for an abundant yield and harvest.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY DEVOTIONS



Devotion to the Divine Mercy is based on the writings of St. Faustina Kowalska, who was canonized by Pope John Paul II.

It concentrates on the mercy poured forth in Christ's death and resurrection, fount of the Holy Spirit who forgives sins and restores joy at having been redeemed.

Part of the preparation for Divine Mercy Sunday is the Divine Mercy Novena. It begins on Good Friday and expresses nine intentions given to St. Faustina by our Lord, who desires that all souls be brought to His loving heart, for His love for us is greater than any of our sins.

Novena: the first day will be prayed on Good Friday following the Stations of the Cross. The novena will be recited in the church immediately after the 8:15 am Mass during the week. You can also say the novena at home.

All are invited to attend a holy hour of prayer and devotion in honor of our Lord's Divine Mercy on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 24, 2022 from 3:00 to 4:00 pm in the church. Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed and we will join the Filipino Choir in singing the Chaplet of Divine Mercy.

Individuals who receive Holy Communion on Divine Mercy Sunday, having made a good confession recently, pray for our Holy Father, and take part in the hour of prayer or who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the *Our Father*, and the *Creed*, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (e.g. "Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!") earn a plenary indulgence (full remission of temporal purification due to sin upon dying), which was approved by Pope John Paul II.
