

From The Community Spiritual Director

Well, things don't seem to be getting better in a hurry, do they? How long? God's people have been asking how long for a long time (see Habakkuk, for example). I have heard from several Emmaus communities this summer and I have yet to find one that is conducting walks. How can we? Can you imagine conducting a walk with social distancing and limited numbers and face masks? It would not be fair to the pilgrims to expect them to experience their walks at the level we did ours under such circumstances. Table communities would suffer. Candlelight would have nowhere near the effect. Meals would be a place where it would be nearly impossible to build relationships. Every aspect of the experience would be reduced to a very low standard of what we have come to expect from our walks. So, what do we do while we anxiously ask, "How long?" and hope that it won't be very long at all.

I was reading Psalm 137 recently. It is a Psalm dealing with the exile of the Israelites to Babylon. The first 4 verses read this way: "By the rivers of Babylon we sat and wept when we remembered Zion. There on the poplars we hung our harps, for there our captors asked us for songs, our tormentors demanded songs of joy; they said, "Sing us one of the songs of Zion." How can we sing the songs of the Lord while in a foreign land?"

I don't know about you, but I can sort of relate to where the people were as these thoughts crossed their mind. With all the violence, anger, hatred, conflict, illness, death, and natural disasters our nation has experienced over the past several months sometimes it can be hard to sing songs of joy. But we must. If we only sing praise and worship when we have the right feelings, we still have a lot to learn about being children of the living God.

As Psalm 137 turns into Psalm 138 we see that even though the circumstances haven't changed, the response has. The first 2 verses of 138 say, "I will praise you Lord, with all my heart; before the "gods" I will sing your praise. I will bow down toward your holy temple and will praise your name for your unfailing love and your faithfulness." Sometimes it seems the "gods" of this world are winning. But know that our one true God is faithful and showers us with an unfailing love.

As the world becomes more and more faithless, we, more than ever, must sing songs of joy. We must bow down and praise his name with all our heart. He has not forgotten us and while we don't know 'how long', he does.

One day, before long, we will join together at Ruggles camp, we will welcome nervous and questioning pilgrims, and we will watch as God does his mighty work to bless them and let them know the depths of his love for them. O yeah, he's going to bless us, too.

Grace and peace to you as you continue to praise his name and sing his songs of joy.

Sponsorship

What does it take to sponsor a pilgrim?

Sponsorship involves a commitment to help the pilgrim get the most out of the Walk to Emmaus.

- 1. It begins with the invitation. You are inviting them to experience a spiritually uplifting event. You need to get the form to them and have them send it to the registrar three months before the walk. Our walks are in May and June and you should be targeting February for the spring walks and June for the fall walks. It is helpful and encouraging to the teams to know they have the minimum number (15) of pilgrims when they begin training. Too often, we have come down to the last week with less than 15 and have scrambled to quickly add almost anyone just to get the numbers up. The process really needs to be thought out. You should be in prayer about the people you sponsor before you ask them without deadlines driving the process. Make sure they note any food restrictions, medical allergies, or special requirements. (Such as a receptacle for a CPAP machine, or help remembering to take their medicine, etc.)
- 2. You will need to check before they come if you can do anything to make their time away from home stress-free. This could involve checking on the house, feeding pets, help with children, whatever may be preventing them from attending the walk.
- Emmaus is not a secret organization. You can tell them that it is a three-day retreat with a series of talks and activities designed to raise their awareness of God's love. Each person's experience and spiritual gain is different.
- 4. You will need to bring them to the walk, stay for dinner, and pray for them in the tabernacle Thursday night. You should help them get checked in and see to it that their bags get to their room. Stay with them until they leave for the walk and answer any questions they may have and then pray for them at the tabernacle.
- 5. You need to attend the Candlelight ceremony on Saturday evening.
- 6. You will need to be at the Closing ceremony on Sunday. You should help them move their stuff out of the dorms and take them home. Please remain open to stopping off for dinner on the way home to allow them to share some of their experience with you.
- 7. One of the most important things you need to do for your new pilgrim is pray for them, not only at the times you may have signed up for, but throughout the walk weekend.

Sponsorship is a big job. The walk depends on getting born-again believers that are ready to learn more about God's grace so they can be more effective servants for His will. Emmaus walks provide opportunities for everyone in the community to serve God. Sponsors are a critical part of each walk.
