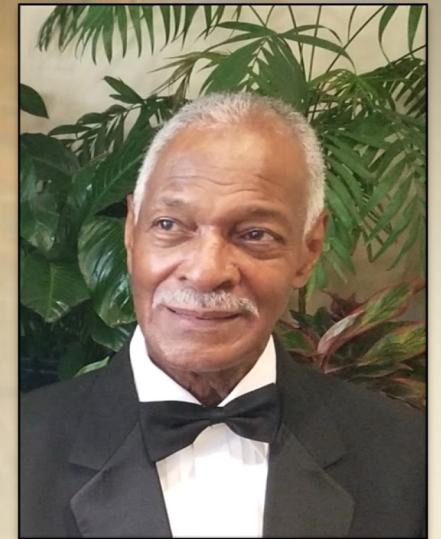

A Life Well Lived

Mr. Marion Edward Hall, Sr. was born to the late Willie Ellis (Jack) Hall, Sr. and Lillie Wade Curry Hall in Winston-Salem, North Carolina on March 20, 1936. He was a graduate of Atkins High School in Winston-Salem and he attended Winston-Salem Teachers College (WSSU).

Mr. Hall enlisted in the military after college and entered the United States Navy. Once he completed his tour of duty, he joined the Naval Reserve as an officer. Mr. Hall was employed with various Country Clubs locally in the area (Old Towne, Forsyth and Twin City) and sometimes traveled to the Western part of the state serving as a bartender. He was employed as a painter for HUD Housing Authority Maintenance staff until he was hired by R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Company. He became a machine operator at R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Company where he was a dedicated employee receiving recognition for a perfect working attendance. Mr. Hall retired from R.J. Reynolds after 30 years of service.

A devoted member of Goler Metropolitan AME Zion Church, he faithfully gave service to the Cathedral Choir, Senior Usher Board, and Men's Choir. Other group organizations he was a faithful member of include the all male singing group, Twin City Choristers, his favorite HBCU, the Winston-Salem Chapter of WSSU National Alumni, and the American Legion Post 220. He was very active in the community until his declining health which limited his active participation.

He found joy in gardening, painting, family cookout gatherings, singing, car detailing, and was an avid seasonal supporter for his favorite HBCU teams of WSSU Football and Basketball, while supporting his favorite ACC team of UNC Chapel Hill.
