Arrive Alive is Britains only registered charity solely dedicated to funding vital lifesaving vehicles and equipment for Community First Responders (CFR's). CFR's are medically trained volunteers who are regulated and dispatched to frontline life threatening 999 calls by West Midlands Ambulance Service.

Demand is greater than ever on our current operational lifesaving vehicles and equipment. An additional nine voluntary operated lifesaving equipped vehicles are urgently needed on the frontline to help CFR's and West Midlands Ambulance to provide even more efficient lifesaving assistance following a 999 call. An Arrive Alive vehicle can reach a 999 medical emergency in those vital seconds/minutes prior to a road or air ambulance due to being directly based within the heart of the community, this results in essential lifesaving treatment being initiated sooner as every second counts.

"Its fantastic the support Arrive Alive has already given to these schemes as they are independent from the Ambulance Service and fund all their own uniform and equipment. For every Car that Arrive Alive has provided to one of our Volunteer schemes that is potentially another life saved in the Community." – Andy Jeynes Community Response Manager for West Midlands Ambulance Service UNHSFT.

A further nine voluntary operated 999 vehicles are urgently needed in the following areas:

Lifesaving equipment and vehicles are solely funded by public donations, no funding is given by the government, NHS, ambulance service or national lottery. Our vehicles and equipment have been still operational on the frontline responding to life threatening 999 calls throughout the Coronavirus pandemic. Funding for the essential lifesaving support that Arrive Alive provides has been impacted by Coronavirus due to the cancellation of fundraising events and bucket collections which is the main sources of charitable income. Demand is greater than ever on Britain's emergency medical services and NHS.

Today, perhaps more than most, we are hoping that we can count on you to support us with a donation to ensure that we can continue to provide lifesaving vehicles as we never know when we might need to call 999. However great or small every donation contributes towards saving a life.

Funding Rapid Emergency Response



Arrive Alive is the only charity of its kind in England solely dedicated to funding vital lifesaving vehicles and equipment for Community First Responder groups (CFR's) who attend 999 medical emergencies.

CFR's are medically trained volunteers who are dispatched via a 999 call, they can attend a medical emergency in those vital seconds/minutes prior to a road or air ambulance due to being directly based within the heart of the community.

Below is the number of life threatening medical emergencies that have been attended by CFR's:



Area of 999 medical emergency	Number of 999 calls attended by CFR's	CFR's first on scene prior to a road or air ambulance

Arden - Solihull	560	507
Staffordshire	1010	956

Equipment and vehicles are not funded by the government, NHS, ambulance service or national lottery. Our vehicles are still operational responding to 999 calls during the pandemic, however we urgently require your support to continue to save lives.



Just some examples of life threatening medical emergencies that an Arrive Alive vehicle can be deployed to following a 999 call prior to a road or air ambulance:

Cardiac Arrest/Heart Attack	Stab or Gun Shot Wounds	Epileptic Seizures
Asthma Attack	Diabetic Emergency	Falls or Fainting
Anaphylaxis (Allergic Reaction)	Paediatric Emergencies	Acid Attacks
RTC - Road Traffic Collision	Stroke	Severe Injuries
Sporting Accidents/Injuries	Sepsis	Major Incidents - i.e. Covid-19

Each equipped operational lifesaving vehicle costs approximately £25,000. Additional lifesaving vehicles are urgently needed, to assist the ambulance service to enable more lives to be saved.
