The District is forming a new Parks/Recreation/Greenbelt Working Group to assist District staff in the development of a comprehensive Parks, Recreation and Greenbelt Management Plan and to make Board recommendations for the \$177,200 in funding the District received from the California State Parks Per Capita grant. Community members are invited to participate in future working group meetings to help develop the plan and also identify priorities for future grant funding and District expenditures. EMERGENCY WILDFIRE/TSUNAMI SIREN SYSTEM is active with six sirens strategically placed throughout Shelter Cove.

If you hear a *3-minute fast alternating hi & low tone* - There is a wildfire with an immediate threat to life and property in Shelter Cove and the need to evacuate may be imminent. Upper elevation residents (homesites above Beach & Shelter Cove Road junction) are advised to immediately evacuate to the Shelter Cove Community Center on Upper Pacific Drive where the CERT team will set up an emergency shelter.

If you hear a *3-minute steady tone* - There might be a Tsunami that can impact beaches and lows area in Shelter Cove, and you should travel to higher ground immediately.

If you hear a *voice prompt*- The Fire Department is trying to notify the community, please listen to the commands and follow all evacuation orders.

If you hear a short *low growl* at 12noon This is the daily diagnostic test and no action should be taken.

Dear Residents and Property Owners –

I want to start by thanking all eight individual candidates who are running for District Board seats this November. Thank you all for stepping up to serve our District and running for office on behalf of the Shelter Cove Community.

While we await this year's election, the District and Shelter Cove Fire want to encourage our community members to stay vigilant and be ready to evacuate in case of a wildfire emergency and prepared to care for yourself and your family while separated from your home.

If you see something...say something. Report all suspected fires, locally generated smoke, fireworks, unsafe vehicles, suspicious activities and reckless behavior by calling 911.

If you feel reluctant at times to call 911, I understand. Please know that we are currently in a tough situation with so many fires burning across the state, and practically all state and federal wildfire suppression resources deployed. Please, if you see something...say something. Please make that timely call and dial 911 - each time and every time. Know that you are protecting your community and the homes of your neighbors.

In the event of a wildfire emergency in Shelter Cove, you and your family will need every second available to be able to successfully respond (be ready to evacuate or evacuate safely and prepared). Please have your **Go Bag** ready and be ready to evacuate with your People, Pets, Papers, Prescriptions, Pictures, Personal Devices (cell phone) and your Plastic (Credit/Debit Cards). And try to keep a full gas tank in your vehicle.

The District and Shelter Cove Fire Department encourages you to sign up for Humboldt Alert. (<https://humboldt.gov.org/2014/Emergency-Notifications/alerts>)

Humboldt ALERT allows the Office of Emergency Services to contact thousands of residents in minutes, so you can find out about an emergency, right away, using methods that you choose such as email, phone, and text message.

You can also text your zip code (95589) to 888777 to sign up for (text only) alerts.
