FULL-TIME JOB VACANCY

Industrial Electrician and Instrument Technician:

Job Duties: Installs electrical circuits, relays, switch gear, wiring, electronic alarms, and telemetering equipment used in the operation and monitoring of high voltage distribution systems, emergency power generators, water pumps and telemetry systems. Troubleshoots, programs, and repairs automated control device; repairs, adjusts, and replaces electrical relays, pumps, motors, and pressure control valves.

Minimum qualifications: High school graduate, clean DMV record and previous experience with Community College, technical or other course work relevant for this position. Passing a pre-employment physical and drug screen required.

Desired qualifications: 3 to-5 years of journey-level experience in electrical and electronic construction, repair and maintenance, preferably with some direct experience at a water/wastewater treatment plant, hydro-electric plant, or similar facilities.

Salary & benefits: Compensation range \$24.55 to \$45.87 BOE. Benefits package includes health, dental, vision insurance and Cal PERS retirement. Application and job description are available from the RID office and website. Vacancy open until filled.

FIRE DEPARTMENT NEWS

Closure of Burn Season is Imminent:

The winter rains are finally dissipating and as we move into a summer weather pattern, the grass, brush and other "light fuels" will dry very rapidly. We ask the community to increase its awareness regarding open burning. When burning please follow the instructions carefully on the back of your AQMD permit. Although it may be an AQMD "burn-day", please check local conditions prior to ignition as the wind and/or dry conditions may make it very unsafe to burn.

Cal FIRE burn permits are now required for all burn piles greater than 4ft in diameter. To obtain a Cal FIRE permit, contact the Garberville office on Alderpoint Road for an application. Phone 923-2645.

As a reminder, grass should be cut annually to a maximum height of 4". Please visit www.readyforwildfire.org for more information regarding preparing for a wildfire.

Fire Department 4th July BBQ and Firewise Event:

The Fire Department will be holding their traditional July 4th BBQ at Marina Motel parking lot at 11 a.m. until the food is gone. There will also be a Firewise community information booth for homeowners with educational material regarding fire hazard abatement.

Firework Safety:

Please be extra safe with fireworks this year as our area has experienced tremendous vegetation growth due to a wet spring. As an alternative to staying in Shelter Cove to celebrate, there is a large organized annual firework display on July 4th at the Benbow Lake State Park, just south of Garberville. The show starts at 9:30 p.m. but arrive early as parking is on a first come first served basis.

Annual Fire Extinguisher Recharge:

The public may bring their fire extinguishers to the Fire House on the morning of Thursday, June 14th, 2018, for recharging by Eureka-Humboldt Fire Extinguisher. The cost of this service will depend on the size of the unit. Units can be paid for when picked up.
