As a reminder, you can only give whole blood every 56 days; therefore, you cannot have given after December 15th. Double Red donors can only give every 112 days; therefore, you cannot have given after October 20th. Sixteen year olds can give blood, but must have parental permission. Mission News: The LCMS has 38 partner churches around the world. A partner church is a church body with which the LCMS has full altar and pulpit fellowship. Many LCMS partner churches also are members of the International Lutheran Council, a worldwide association of confessional Lutheran church bodies. Some LCMS partner churches came into existence through LCMS-supported mission efforts, while others have historic roots that pre-date the LCMS or that are sourced in the mission efforts of other Lutheran church bodies. *Give thanks as you pray that the Lord would open up the hearts and minds of people around the world, so that His grace-filled message can be spread far and wide.*

Generosity Moment: 1 Corinthians 12:16 – “And if the ear should say, ‘Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body,’ that would not make it any less a part of the body.” The Lord has called each of us individually and given each of us unique gifts.
