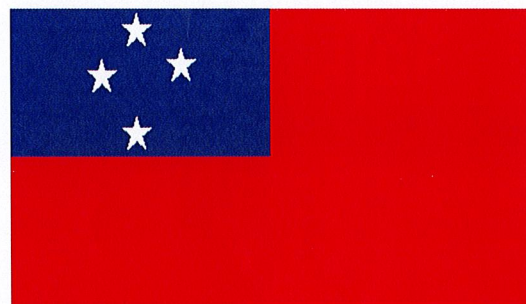

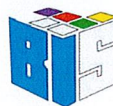
Ola manuia le anofale which means strengthen the posts of your house, for all to thrive.
