SHELTER COVE ROAD SLIDE-OUT REPAIR

On Tuesday, February 25th the Humboldt County Board of Supervisors awarded the construction project to repair of the Shelter Cove Road slide-out located above the Hillside drive intersection to McCollough Construction Inc. Work is scheduled to begin mid-April and may continue through the summer. Traffic will be diverted along Telegraph Creek Road or along Hillside and Toth Roads. Please drive courteously and carefully to reduce impacts to these residential neighborhoods. The whole repair project is estimated to cost \$3,247,656 and it is being funded by Federal Highway Administration Emergency Relief Funds Advance Construction (88.5%) and the Humboldt County Road Fund (11.47%).

Utility Pole and Meter Maintenance:

The District would like to remind property owners who have agreed to maintain the area around power poles to clear away vegetation in readiness for the fire season. The meter reader is requesting customers to clear vegetation from their meters to help reduce the chance of a meter read error.

Emergency Disaster Preparedness Committee Meetings Schedule:

The RID and Shelter Cove Fire Department have organized a series of emergency disaster planning meetings to be held in the Fire Station Meeting Hall. The committee will meet on the second Friday of each month at 1:30 PM. The next meeting will be on Friday, April 13th. Please bring your ideas and obtain knowledge to help us all stay safe.

TSUNAMI DRILL TAKES SHAPE

On Tuesday, March 24th people located within the Tsunami zone are being asked to take action and evacuate to the Fire Station which is a primary evacuation site.

At 9 AM the community is invited to meet at the



Clubhouse in readiness for the 10 AM test of the Shelter Cove Emergency Alert Sirens. Once the sirens have been activated there will be an organized "walk-up" Machi Road or drive up Shelter Cove Road to the Fire Station where people will be given an emergency preparedness presentation by NOAA weather staff, Humboldt County OES, Shelter Cove Fire Department and Shelter Cove CERT. Complementary refreshments will be served. Please have your to-go bag with you. A list of emergency supply items can be found on the RID website under the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Department link. A printable list can be found at the bottom of the page. CERT will be available at the Fire Station to assess the success of the test. CERT will be displaying shelter cots demonstrating "What We Can do for You" and "What You Can do for Yourself".

The next day on Wednesday, March 25th between 11:00AM and Noon there will be a tri-county-wide test of the Tsunami Warning Communications System. This will consist of TV and radio announcements, and activation of NOAA Weather Radios. Shelter Cove sirens will not be activated.
