# **Printer Cartridges**

We have come across a really easy way to raise funds for the Playscheme through recycling used ink cartridges.

We are working with a company called 'Empties Please'. They recycle used ink and toner cartridges the environmentally friendly way and will donate the money raised back to us!

It's very simple. All we have to do is collect used ink and toner cartridges and put them in the enclosed envelope. When our bin is full we send it back to 'Empties Please' They process our recycle bin and donate the money raised straight back to us. We will also receive a certificate to display with a rolling total of how well we are doing.

They will pay us 75p for each original branded manufacturer ink cartridge\* 25p for a remanufactured ink cartridge\* and 50p per original manufacturer laser toner cartridge.

You can collect ink cartridges from absolutely anywhere; school, work, home, clubs, etc so please ask your friends and family to collect too. Hand them over to Carol on a Saturday or drop them into the office in Stapleford.
